The Council was saddened to hear that former Town Councillor Sheila Forster had passed away on Good Friday.

Sheila made an outsanding contribution to the town and served as Town Mayor in 2000/2001 and 2005/2006. We send our condolences and heartfelt sympathies to Sheila's family.

Station Road Project

The Council has submitted a planning application to transform the centre of the town.

The proposal is to build new community headquarters on Station Road for two of the town's most successful organisations, the Flitwick Scout Group and the Royal British Legion.

Part of the Market Town Regeneration Project, plans also include a short-stay shoppers' car park to help boost trade for local retailers and businesses.

As part of the project the Council is also proposing that a retirement living facility is built on the remainder of the land it owns on Station Road. This would give the over 55's community an opportunity to remain living independently in privately-owned flats, close to town facilities. Full details and plans will be shared on social media and in the next issue.

Following its success last year, Flitwick Town Councillors have once again decided to give residents the opportunity to suggest projects they would like to deliver in the town. The 'Resident Driven Projects' initiative will allow you to give your project ideas that the Town Council can deliver with your participation. This is not a grant, this is something different. Proposals should have approximate costs and be submitted to the Town Council office at The Rufus Centre by no later than 5pm on **Friday 28th June**. You can download a proposal form and supporting information from the Town Council website.

The criteria for proposals is simple:

- Deliverable and cost to not exceed £10,000
- Costs to include both capital and maintenance
- Direct benefits to residents of Flitwick
- Wide appeal to all parts of the community
- Proposals by residents only

Projects could be an event (e.g. Exhibition or Festival), an installation (e.g. a sensory garden), a regular activity (e.g. a support group or interest group) or any other idea fitting the criteria. For more information visit our website or contact annesmith@flitwick.gov.uk.

The projects will be chosen by a Panel and residents will be able to vote for their favourite project!

2018 Project Update

Last year's Resident Driven Projects chosen by the Flitwick community are now well underway.

The three chosen Resident Driven Projects were all for Manor Park: the placement of three additional uniquely carved natural benches, a pond dipping platform and a wildflower meadow.

Work and planning for these projects continues to go on behind the scenes.



There have been a few delays along the way. Special permission needed to be sought from Natural England and the County Archaeologist, (which we are pleased to report has now been granted). The wildflower seed sowing and planting has been postponed until the autumn when the rain brings more favourable conditions. In addition, the water level in the lake needs to come back to previous levels before work can begin on the pond dipping platform.

We hope visitors to Manor Park will see the results of these projects before the end of the year and will be able to enjoy their benefits for many years to come.

The Rufus Centre's in-house catering team made some fantastic mini-cupcakes to tempt visitors to the exhibition stand. They proved to be very popular!





Two young swimmers from Flitwick Dolphins, Ida and Abigail, took part in the day and had the following positive feedback:


"I was so happy because I realised that this is everything that I want to do." (Abigail)

Flitwick Scouts on the Trail!

All sections of Flitwick Scout Group participated in a worldwide event known as "Jamboree on the Trail" (JOTT). There were two stages of this year's event; a walk of eight miles in the morning and five miles in the afternoon. Most of those who took part walked the whole distance.

Six children were awarded their Bronze Chief Scout Award by Jonathan Smith, lead volunteer for the Group. Lucy Tucker, one of the recipients of the award, was also presented with the final one of all of the activity badges she could gain. These included builder, camp craft, global issues, health and



fitness and space. She did reveal that her favourite badge was 'animal friend.' Other activities have included sowing sunflowers. The programme over the next few weeks includes visiting the allotment to transplant the sunflowers; and learning about disabilities.

The Cub Scouts have been using their senses by going on a blindfold trail at Houghton House and also following a tracking trail in Ampthill Park. Events on their programme over the next few weeks include a visit to the fire station, fire lighting and cooking and trampolining.

We're so grateful to be recognised as this year's 'Local Group' at the Flitwick Community Awards. Like a lot of groups, there's usually a personal reason behind them. For us, it was the deaths of two daughters; Lizzie Barnes from Westoning and our

own daughter, Becki, from Flitwick. Lizzie had been a Harlington student; Becki a Redborne one. Both succeeded in getting to uni. Both took their own lives.

Nigel Washington, Vicar of Westoning and our Co-Chair, led the funerals. As previous Head of Sixth Form at Harlington Upper, his concern for young people prompted a resolve to meet and discuss mental health; a Forum. That was in early 2015. We started 6-monthly meetings on different subjects, such as Self-Harm, Suicide, Eating Disorder, Anxiety and Self-Esteem. At the suggestion of one of our young members, we added 'Busy Getting Stronger' to our name, to highlight our positive message. From beginnings at Flitwick Cricket Club, we moved to The Rufus Centre, and then to meetings at Redborne and Harlington Upper Schools.

Our events are free and open to everyone; students, professionals, parents and carers. Financial

support, including last year's nomination as a Town Mayor's Charity, helps to make our service freely available. While we do not offer counselling, we are always ready to listen, and we have a comprehensive resource of information and support addresses to 'signpost' to. Our wonderful committee and helpers also work with other groups, such as Mind BLMK, Chums, Bedfordshire Suicide Bereavement Service, and Papyrus (Prevention of Young Suicide).

More than anything, we hope we have got people talking. We are constantly amazed by the willingness of young people to speak about mental health issues and the growing movement of students in our schools who promote mental wellbeing.

Our sessions have also introduced professionals to these schools, who now work with them,

and we ourselves have been invited to take part in school training. Support for parents and carers is also much needed, so we hope that we help them to make more informed choices and to feel that they are not alone.

Just four years ago, when we started, we had no idea where our work would lead. On behalf of those we have loved and lost, thank you for our award.
