



Link-A-Ride Campaign Need Your Help



Link-A-Ride no longer have funding from Central Bedfordshire Council. We've been working hard behind the scenes to replace that funding without raising the prices that our members would have to pay, and we're still doing everything we can to save the services we provide to our members, but sadly we are coming to the end of the road. If we are unable to secure funding for next year, we will have to close. At the moment, we can run until 31st December 2019.

Link-A-Ride have provided community transport for over 30 years to local people who are unable to use public transport due to age or disability, but we are so much more than that. We play a key role in supporting vulnerable residents and reducing social isolation and loneliness through community events such as afternoon teas, Christmas lunch and regular trips offering the opportunity to shop and socialise. We work in partnership with organisations like the MS

Therapy Centre and Headway to give individuals the flexible support they need to attend vital therapy sessions. For many, our service is a lifeline that enables them to take part in their community and without us, they would rarely leave home.

Our drivers go above and beyond the call of duty and our members look forward to seeing their familiar faces, especially those who do not receive many visitors.

We are still doing everything we can to try and find additional funding, but we don't have much more time. Since CBC funding was withdrawn, Link-A-Ride have worked hard to reduce costs and increase alternative sources of income without cutting services to their members.

We would need to charge £10 extra per trip to break even, but the impact of such a huge price rise on members would be significant, so we need to raise £72,000 to continue to run Link-A-Ride at the current level of service for 12 months.

Over the last 12 months we have provided 6,354 trips for local people and transported 2,273 wheelchair users


heroes who mean a great deal to the families that they support.

Flitwick Scouts Up For A Challenge!

Flitwick Scout Group provides a wide range of opportunities for children age 6 to 13. They also provide opportunities for young people aged 14 to 17 to be young leaders where they can develop numerous skills; and they provide opportunities for adults to help young people develop and to share their skills and knowledge with others.

The Beavers have been trampolining, building models using Lego as part of their Builder badge and making snowmen using rather large marshmallows. They have also been singing carols to the residents of Howard Court.

The Cubs have been on an evening hike across Flitton and Flitwick Moors. They have also worked towards their Astronomer badge; have been bowling and learnt about road safety. During their Christmas craft evening the children learnt how to sew using decorative cross stitching. The road safety evening included them finding out about different types of pedestrian crossings, identifying road signs and car safety. They were able to put the theory into practice on their evening hike.

The Scouts have also been working towards their Cooking and Navigator badges. Members of both Scout Troops participated in 'Green Beret' organised by Hertfordshire Scouts. The event lasted two days and involved team working, encouraging each other and leadership. Luke Humphreys and Daniel Green said: "The activities included getting a ring off a rope, catapult building, pulling a jeep, rifle shooting, folding up a tarpaulin whilst standing on it, orienteering, karaoke, getting out of a maze and an obstacle course. The conditions for the event were rather wet and muddy."

Some of the Scouts who attended the event have used the opportunity to work towards their Media Relations and Marketing badge. Edmund Jarrett said: "I really



enjoyed 'Green Beret'. I thought it was good because even though it was hard when we finished it was very rewarding. The catapulting was fun as we got extra points for ingenuity. Climbing the pole was my favourite activity because you had to work as a team to hold the pole whilst one person climbed it and put a bucket on the top."

Adult volunteer Simon Baldwin said: "Green Beret took all of the Scouts and the adults out of their comfort zone. All of the Scouts worked well together and they achieved some great results. They had gone into this event without much knowledge of what the challenges were going to be. Everyone enjoyed it and I'm sure we'll be there again next year."
