Annual Report

The Annual Town Meeting on 6th May was held online this year, for the first time in its history. Despite this, we were delighted that a number of residents were able to join us virtually.

The Annual Report was presented by Cllr Jeremy Dann, Town Mayor 2020/21. Reviewing one of the most challenging years for everyone, Cllr Dann's report commented on different areas of work the Council had been able to carry out, when lockdown restrictions permitted.

Although many events had to be cancelled, staff have kept in touch with residents who regularly attend events, preparing online activity packs for children and arranging home deliveries for people who normally attend the Over 60s Lunch Club with the help of some Councillors and volunteers.

The pandemic has seen the people of Flitwick being very creative and supportive in helping their neighbours, offering their time to the Community Lifeline. Volunteers have shone through helping people in so many ways, including helping the Vaccine Hub at The Rufus Centre run smoothly.

Refurbishment of many areas of The Rufus Centre has taken place. The opening of the Rendezvous Café & Bar has been a great success and is already a popular meeting place for the community.

A lot of work has taken place behind the scenes to set the stage for a range of improvements to how the Council delivers services. The Council has reviewed a number of areas and will be seeking a formal accreditation for how it operates through the Local Council Award Scheme (LCAS).

Members have also worked on a draft Strategic Plan on how we see Flitwick and the Town Council developing over the next five years, and what might be our priorities for developing services and amenities. The public consultation on this is still open and we hope that residents will take the opportunity to contribute to the future of Flitwick.



For The Love Of Hedgehogs

An exciting campaign is underway in Flitwick to help Britain's iconic spikey little friends. With talks on the local radio, leaflet drops and ambitious plans, enthusiastic volunteers are keen to make sure Flitwick's hedgehog population flourishes in a town where hedgehogs have made their home.



The last few decades have seen an alarming decline in hedgehog

numbers and reasons include less places for hogs to roam to find food and mates. A hedgehog can cover up to 2km in one night looking for slugs and other creepy crawlies, making them a formidable natural pesticide.

Since starting this March, the campaign email address has been busy with Flitwick residents sending in photos of their nocturnal visitors. They encourage them by cutting a 13cm x 13cm 'hedgehog highway' into a gate, fence or wall. This size means dogs can't get through but hedgehogs can.

Many residents also provide fresh water along with supplementing their natural diet with some kibble or meaty cat or dog food (not mealworms) and enjoy seeing hogs snuffling around in their garden.

Not using pesticides so hedgehogs don't eat poisoned snails and slugs is a big help, as is ensuring ponds have a sloped side or escape ramp for any who might fall in. Also, building a log pile or a hog house using British Hedgehog Preservation Society (BHPS) templates encourage hogs to sleep or nest in gardens.

Often reported in Flitwick is the amount of hedgehog casualties on our roads. Hedgehog's eyesight is poor and won't see a speeding car until it's too late. Their defence mechanism is to curl into a ball when threatened which is no match for a vehicle. So please slow down.

If you find a hedgehog staggering around, lying still (not in a nest) with flies around it or spread out in the sun, or otherwise obviously sick or injured, use gardening gloves or a towel to gently pick it up, put it inside in a newspaper lined box, cover with a towel or fleece and offer some meaty cat or dog food and water. Once the hedgehog is settled, call the BHPS on 01584 890 801 or a vet for further advice.

Wildflower Project Flourishes

Wildflower corridors in Millennium Park, Hinksley Road Recreation Ground and Station Road green space are now in place.

A stone burier machine made light work of preparing the soil in April before the Public Realm Team scattered the wildflower seeds.

Wildflower corridors help bee and butterfly populations, providing an important source of pollen and nectar for pollinating insects. They also provide habitat and food, directly and indirectly, for many other species.

The Town Council is also planning wildflower corridors at The Rufus Centre field and ditches. If you have suggestions where you would like to see new wildflower corridors please get in touch.

Look out for news on how you can volunteer to get involved in maintaining the wildflower corridors and help with selective weeding and litter picking so that these beautiful areas can flourish naturally.





Cattle Return To Manor Park

Limousin-cross cattle returned to graze in the paddocks in Manor Park in June.

Manor Park is maintained in line with a Natural England Stewardship Scheme. The Stewardship Scheme provides funding towards the maintenance of the park, and requires grassland in the paddocks to be managed and improved. Cattle are the best and recommended way to manage wetland grass. Cattle grazing helps maintain the structure and



composition of wildlife habitats upon which a variety of plants and animals depend for their survival.

Thank You Samuel

A big thank you to Samuel Humphrey who has just completed three months of litter picking at Hinksley Road Recreation Ground as part of his volunteering commitment for the Duke of Edinburgh Award.

Samuel, a Year 9 student at Redborne Upper School, has collected a huge amount of litter since he started the campaign in February, keeping a litter picking journal each week of what he has found in the field and hedgerow as evidence for the Award.

The Council is very grateful for Samuel's hard work clearing the litter, but it's been very disappointing to read his journal and see exactly how much litter is being left on a regular basis.



Samuel said:

"If we all took responsibility of taking home our own litter, the countryside would remain a fresher and cleaner place. Manmade material never breaks down but we keep making more and more of it. Everyone can spare five minutes in picking up their litter, dog poo, cans and bottles which causes harm to communities and wildlife. It is entirely preventable!"

If you visit Hinksley Road Recreation Ground, please place your rubbish in a bin or take it home with you for recycling and do not throw items in the hedgerow (or hang dog waste bags in trees!). Sadly, as well as glass bottles, cans, plastic, etc., Samuel found other objects discarded such as a table lamp, toy buggy, pieces of carpet and half a skateboard.



Since lockdown it's been great to see more people than ever out exploring the local area. If bins are full, please take your litter home with you and recycle where you can. We all need to play our part in keeping our parks, play areas and green spaces clean for everyone to enjoy.

New Outdoor Gyms

You will soon be able to exercise outside on new outdoor gym equipment being installed in Hinksley Road Recreation Ground and at Millennium Park.

Four pieces of gym equipment focusing on cardio and strength exercises will be installed at each location.

The new equipment is due to be in place by the end of June and has been funded by Section 106 monies and a grant from the Flitwick & District Youth Association.

Flitwick Library News

Home Library Service

The Home Library Service, offered by Central Bedfordshire Council Libraries, is a library outreach service available to people of all ages who want to read or listen to books at home but are limited in accessing to their local library. To be eligible for this service at least one of the following criteria must be met: if you do not wish to visit a public space due to COVID-19; have difficulties visiting a local library due to disability or ill health; cannot access a local library without help or are a carer who may find it difficult to visit the library due to the nature of their caring duties.

The Home Library Service offers eligible customers a home delivery of up to 10 items which may be any combination of regular or large print books, spoken word CDs or children's board books and picture books, all tailored to what you like to read or listen to. The Home Library Service is free of charge and will be delivered directly to your home.

Rendezvous Café & Bar


