#### **Youth Skate Competition**


A big thank you to everyone who took part in the Youth Skate Competition on 22nd August at Millennium Park, organised by the Town Council and 4YP.

of many people who made the day such a great success, kindly providing their services free of charge – the musicians, graffiti artists, judges, sponsors and all those who donated prizes.


Special thanks to Joe Smethan and Tierney Joel who helped organise the competition, working tirelessly behind the scenes leading up to the event and on the day itself.

The Hub has undergone an amazing transformation over the summer.


The building has had a full redecoration complete with some new equipment and furniture, and new doors. We think the space looks fantastic with its bright, colourful wall designs.

#### Flitwick Surgery Update

We would like to thank our patients for their consideration during the challenging pandemic period, during which the surgery remained open with our clinical and admin staff all working to maintain services and deal with additional workload as a result of the global health crisis.

With the transition to telephone triage we now have more patient contacts every day whilst retaining face-to-face appointments for those who need to be seen in person. Other services, including immunisations, cytology screening and phlebotomy, are also back to pre-pandemic levels.

We are re-modelling the waiting room which we intend to re-open in the next couple of weeks. For the safety of patients and staff, we still need visitors to wear a face mask at all times and our staff will do the same. We will continue to ensure distancing within the premises and are allowing a limited number of people in at a time (primarily those waiting for their appointment, enquiries or collecting paperwork/ prescriptions).

#### **Winter Flu Clinics**

The clinics started on 14th September and this year will run from 9am to 8pm to make it easier for people to attend appointments. Last year we vaccinated over 4,000 people in the area.

To help with bookings, appointments can be booked directly through the NHS or Airmid apps or SystmOnline account. Alternatively, you can book via the Flitwick Surgery website or give us a call.

Once we receive the rest of our flu stock dates for October will be available and for those aged under 18 years. Details will be posted on our website and we will send reminders to our patients.

Going forward, we will be reviewing if we can expand our online booking platform for other types of appointments.

#### **Blood Bottle Shortage**

We would like to thank all our patients for their patience regarding the national shortage of blood sample bottles.

In July we took in the region of 700 patient blood samples and worked hard to bring our service back to pre-pandemic levels. Due to the current national shortage we have had to scale back our routine blood testing. Once the shortage is over we will commence this service. We value our patients' consideration as this national shortage has created a problem across the NHS.

### When Harry Met Adam!

Flitwick Dolphin's swimmer Harry Rowson had an amazing time with Olympic champion Adam Peaty as well as other swimming Olympians at Adam Peaty's 'AP Race Clinic Tour 2021' held at Repton School, Derbyshire.

The day was separated into three parts for the swimmers with a separate session just for parents.

The first session for the swimmers was land training with work in the gym led by Rob Norman, who is Adam Peaty's gym coach. This focused on numerous bodyweight exercises and improving swimming specific pathways.

The second session was called 'Racing Edge' and was based around the mental side of racing and how elite swimmers get the winning edge through focus and mental fortitude.

The third session, probably the most exciting one for Harry, was in the swimming pool. 45 minutes with Ed Baxter who is Adam's swim partner, focusing on the push off and turns with, not surprisingly, Adam focusing on breaststroke.



Adam then went through arm exercises, firstly doing mini breaststroke then showing them how he did 'speed arms' and gauging how many pulls they could do in 15m. A pull buoy was then used for a breaststroke kick set and to see how many kicks they could do as a minimum with strong propulsion over 15m. Harry learned that he is able to cover 15m with three breaststroke kicks.

Out of the pool, to finalise the day's events, there was a great presentation made by Adam with a Q & A session.

All in all Harry had an absolutely amazing time with Adam and other Olympians. He now proudly wears his Adam Peaty swim cap at training and has come away with wonderful memories.

#### **Business Awards Success**

Flitwick based Teaching Talons enjoyed great success at the SME Luton & Bedfordshire Business Awards held at the end of June, walking away with two awards on the night.

The mobile zoo company won the Business Innovation category and Teaching Talons owner, Becky Meredith-Shaw won Business Woman of the Year.

Commenting on the awards Becky said: "Both

awards were primarily based on my work through the lockdowns last year to provide free 'Facebook Live Lessons' for all the children home schooling.
