### **Prime Public Space**

In November Flitwick Town Council successfully completed the purchase of the Barclays Bank building and frontage in the centre of town and is now the proud owner of this prime public space for the community to enjoy.

This is an amazing opportunity for Flitwick Town Council to develop the frontage into a public space that will become a central hub for the whole



community. Commenting on the purchase, Town Mayor, Cllr Andy Snape said: "We viewed it as a once in a lifetime opportunity to secure a valuable community benefit and were determined to mitigate the risk of the property being taken over by a private developer and converted to residential use.

"When we announced our intention to pursue the purchase, we received overwhelmingly positive feedback about the prospect from residents. Our recent resident survey highlighted the lack of public space and a focus area in the town centre. We will now work together with residents to ensure that the space is utilised to its full potential."

Barclays Bank has a lease on the building until 2026, and the Council is looking forward to seeing the bank continue to provide a very well valued banking service in the town.

A Public Works Loan has funded the purchase of the property.

The Town Council were thrilled to use the space for the Christmas Lights Switch On! Watch this space for news of many more exciting events to come.

## **Christmas Lights Shine Bright**

Flitwick celebrated the Christmas Lights Switch On with a welcome return of a Christmas tree in the town centre.

It was wonderful to see so many people join in the festivities in the area outside Barclays Bank, recently purchased by the Town Council.

Local traders and organisations sold festive gifts, food and drink throughout the afternoon.

Father Christmas and his Chief Elf made a special visit, much to the delight of children and after the countdown to the switch on, Ampthill Town Band accompanied the crowd singing carols around the Christmas tree.

With snow falling as the countdown began it really was a magical start to the Christmas festivities in Flitwick.











## Work Starts On Interchange

On 10th November Town Mayor, Councillor Andy Snape joined the Leader of Central Bedfordshire Council, Councillor Richard Wenham, at an official ground-breaking event to mark work starting on the new Flitwick Transport Interchange.

Once completed, a new station forecourt, taxi and passenger drop off areas and dedicated facilities for Center Parcs Woburn visitors will be



available. The project also includes improvements to Steppingley Road, including vehicle access to both the station and Tesco.

There will be traffic disruption during this time with road closures and diversions in place and the Town Council will be monitoring the situation carefully.

Along with SEMLEP, which is contributing  $\pm 2.2$  million secured from the government's Getting Building Fund, CBC is investing nearly  $\pm 2.5$  million into the project, alongside  $\pm 167,000$  in Section 106 developer contributions.

Central Bedfordshire Council has been sending letters to residents and businesses with information on planned works.

### **Crematorium Plans**

A new planning application has been submitted for Central Bedfordshire's first crematorium. Central Bedfordshire Council withdrew the original planning application for the proposed crematorium off Fordfield Road in Steppingley, to have time to make changes following public feedback.

Changes since the last planning application include a new 40mph speed limit on Fordfield Road following safety concerns raised by residents. A proposed cycleway and footway link has also been installed.

The crematorium would remain in the same location as previously submitted back in March, on agricultural land with access from Fordfield Road.

We were delighted that those who were not able to attend in person were able to join via a social media live stream.

The War Memorial was covered in beautiful knitted and crocheted poppies created by the Stitchers group and members of the local community.

Thank you to everyone who took part and made the Remembrance Parade and Service such a success.



### Do You Want to Help Shape The Town's Future Development?

The Town Council is looking at the feasibility of creating a Neighbourhood Plan for Flitwick.

Driven by the local community, a Neighbourhood Plan gives you a greater say over what development goes where, what that development could look like, and what sort of improvements to transport, services and other facilities you would like to see in the future.

A Neighbourhood Plan sits alongside the National Planning Policy Framework and the local authority's Local Plan. It is a policy document that Central Bedfordshire Council would have to consider in their planning decisions.

In creating a Neighbourhood Plan, we would want to work closely with the local community to ensure it reflects your needs, and what you want the future of the town to be like. We are currently seeing whether creating this plan is feasible, and part of this process is seeing whether this is something you want to help develop.



#### Get Involved

Creating a Neighbourhood Plan can take some time, and so what we want to know is if you are interested in helping with the work to create it. All you need to do at this stage is tell us that you are interested in helping – you are not signing up to anything yet.

In addition, if you have any specialist skills that would be useful in helping create the Neighbourhood Plan, such land use planning, project management and data analysis please let us know.

#### Flitwick Town Council's Role in Planning Decisions

Flitwick Town Council's Planning Committee meets every three weeks to consider planning applications for the town and agree a response to submit to the planning authority.

The planning authority in this area is Central Bedfordshire Council. Planning application decisions are generally made by CBC Planning Officers, however larger developments or more controversial applications likely to have an impact on the community may be considered by the CBC Development Management Committee.

The Town Council is one of a number of consultees in the planning process. It provides written responses to CBC on all applications and a representative from the Town Council may attend CBC planning meetings to speak as a consultee if needed. Spring 2022 will see the improvement of both Station Road and Beaumont Court play areas!

Both sites will include a variety of exciting new equipment for children to explore including Springboard See-Saw, Tightrope Walk, Snowboard and a Multi-Play installation with 9 different play features.

The Council are investing £16,000 in the project which we hope will be enjoyed for many years to come.

## **Flitwick Surgery Update**

We are very pleased that we can now welcome patients back into our waiting room. This is open from 9.30am to 6pm. To keep everyone as safe as possible we ask that you observe the following:

 We operate a `one in and one out' system when the waiting room is full. If all chairs are in use, please wait outside the building until one becomes available.



- A maximum of two people standing at the front desk area.
- Face coverings are to be worn at all times when anyone is in the building.

### Dispensary

Our Dispensary is now accessible in person during our opening hours. Patients can come in to collect or ask questions regarding their prescriptions. Payment can be made by both cash or card. There is no need to make an appointment to collect your medication.

### **Flu Vaccinations**

Like other surgeries we have struggled with delayed stock deliveries from our supplier for which we apologise to our patients. However, we now have flu vaccination clinics up and running for children, under 65 and over 65 year old patients. These appointments can be booked online if you have a SystmOne or NHS App account or by contacting the surgery via our website or phone (please call after 11am).

### **Covid Vaccinations**

Since the start of November we have been concentrating on providing COVID-19 booster vaccinations to our more vulnerable patients including those in our nearby care homes.

Clinics are being run on Wednesday at the Surgery BY APPOINTMENT ONLY. We have been contacting patients by text and phone as they become eligible. If you are an elderly patient or have an elderly relative struggling to get to a vaccination centre then please do get in contact. We have limited resources for home visits so would appreciate wherever possible that patients attend either the Surgery or one of the walk in clinics, such as Chicksands Priory House.

### **Squirrels Join Flitwick Scouts!**

Over 40 Squirrels (boys and girls aged 4 and 5) have recently joined Flitwick Scout Group. The Scouts had given approval to the newest and youngest section to start for 35 years.

The Group made the decision to open two dreys as they had over 40 children on their joining list that could join immediately. Within a very short space of time both of the dreys were nearly full. Volunteer, Nigel Taylor said, "We made the decision to have one drey on a Thursday starting at 4.00pm for an hour and the other one on a Saturday morning starting at 9.30am. Within a couple of days word had got around and we had more children wanting to join.

With two dreys, four Beaver Colonies (boys and girls aged 6 to 8), three Cub Packs (boys and girls aged 8 to 10), two Scout Troops (boys and girls aged 10 to 14) and an associated Explorer Unit (boys and girls aged 14 to 17) there are close on 300 children and young people involved with the Group. Darren Reeve, Lead volunteer for the Group said, "We opened the Squirrel Dreys and this gave 40 children the opportunity to get involved. 
