
Bedfordshire Parish Paths Partnership (P3) volunteers have been working with our Public Realm Team on this project. We hope the new footpath will be completed by the summer.

Planning further ahead we're delighted to have received funding from the Rural Payments Agency and Greensand Country to create a Parkland Management Plan.


Working with experts in this field we will be looking at several key elements to restore Manor Park to its former glory for everyone to enjoy.

Hedgehog Campaign Update

Since the Flitwick Hedgehog Survey ended in November 2021, things have seemingly gone quiet on the campaign front. However, a flurry of writing and data analysis is going on behind the scenes for a report that will be sent to Central Bedfordshire Council to lobby them for hedgehog/wildlife signage in the town.

Our iconic urban hedgehogs have declined by a third since the millennium and need our help. The cause is complicated and



research points to several reasons not least our dense road networks and large hedgehog roaming ranges. These little creatures can travel up to 2km in one night.

The preliminary survey results show that Flitwick has a significant hedgehog population with 616 sightings reported in over 100 roads from June to November 2021 and further analysis is underway such as where hedgehogs were seen the most.

Hedgehogs are one of the few mammals that are true hibernators; they drop their body temperature to match their surroundings and enter a state called torpor. This slows down all other bodily functions and allows them to save a lot of energy but makes normal activity impossible. Their fuel supply comes from the fat stores built up over the summer. Any disturbance during this period can be extremely dangerous as hedgehogs use their precious energy reserves to become active again, so make sure to be careful when gardening or clearing as there may be a sleeping hedgehog hidden somewhere.

Hedgehogs usually hibernate from October/November through to March/April. Now is the perfect time to start putting out some meaty cat or dog food and clean water for hungry hedgehogs coming out of hibernation. This will give them a good start for their year ahead.

Making your garden hedgehog friendly by putting 13cm x 13cm holes in your fence, walls and gates, and not using pesticides or slug pellets in preparation for the spring when hedgehogs are active again may encourage a little visitor. You can find more information on www.hedgehogstreet.org



500 specimen trees, saplings and hedgerow will be planted across Flitwick for the Queen's Green Canopy this spring thanks to our successful application to Central Bedfordshire Council's Tree Planting Grant scheme.

In celebration of the Platinum Jubilee, the Queen's Green Canopy initiative will see new trees and hedgerow planted throughout the town to add to the existing tree cover and natural scrub, and create new habitat for wildlife to flourish.

Species include Rowan, Wild Cherry, Silver Birch, Lime and Beech trees as well as Hawthorn, Blackthorn and Hazel native hedgerow.

Flitwick Gardeners' Assocation, Bedfordshire Youth Rangers and the Parish Paths Partnership (P3) group have kindly volunteered to assist our Public Realm Team with the planting in Hinksley Recreation Ground, Station Road and Beaumont Court play areas, and on the grassed area at the bottom of Station Road.
