

Hundreds of residents took their time to complete the first Annual Residents' Survey, where individuals were encouraged to share their views on living in Flitwick; the work of the Town Council and the Councillors, and the services and facilities it provides.

The results, along with the 2021/22 Annual Report, were presented to members of the public at the Annual Town Assembly in April. Guest Speakers from Ampthill Community Policing Team and Central Bedfordshire Council's Safer Central Team were also in attendance.

Feedback highlighted that 65% of respondents trust Flitwick Town Council either a great deal or a fair amount and 64% felt that the Town Council acts on the concerns of residents.

Shape The Future of Flitwick's Developments

The Town Council has established a new Planning Improvement Working Group for Flitwick. If you are a resident who wants to influence the future development of the town, then signing up for this group may be just for you. The Town Council's role in the planning process is to represent the wider community and comment on applications as a consultee. For sites that have already been allocated for development in the CBC Local Plan, it is likely that development will proceed and in these cases it is essential to ensure that the best possible outcomes can be negotiated for the town. The Planning Improvement Working Group has been formed with the aim of engaging with Central Bedfordshire Council, residents, and developers to try to influence plans before they reach an advanced stage. The hope is to reduce any impact and to ensure that the community gets the maximum benefit from planned developments. We want to work closely with the community on planning matters in the future, and we would love for you to be part of this. Being part of the group will involve some time commitment on your part, but you will be working with a group committed to making a difference. You will work alongside likeminded people and Town Councillors to influence development in the town. No Mow May Initiative

The amenity use of these areas will be preserved so that residents can continue to enjoy the green spaces benefitting from wildlife friendly mowing. In addition, we will not be mowing any of the wildflower areas we created

last year in Millennium Park, Station Road and Hinksley Road Recreation Ground.

We will be cutting the grass in Flitwick Cemetery as normal this year as it is not part of our reduced mowing plans for this summer.




See your Favourite Flitwick Photo in Print

Flitwick - 'A Hedgehog Friendly Town'

The Campaign Team is delighted to announce that the 'Signage to Save Lives' report to lobby for wildlife-slow signage is now out and was sent to Central Bedfordshire Council, Flitwick Town Council and its partners in May.

A total of 616 sightings were reported between June and November 2021 town-wide. The report findings are perhaps unsurprising but this robust evidence gathered and analysed using scientific methods shows a thriving hedgehog population in and around Flitwick.

Hedgehogs have clearly made Flitwick their home and need protection. Flitwick is an urban town with a dense road network surrounded by fields. Fields with hedgerows and woodland are a natural habitat for hedgehogs who can roam up to 2km per night. Research shows that roadkill is a strong contributor to the sharp decline of hedgehog numbers over the last 40 years.

The report also shows that 96% of survey respondents support the town's hedgehog population by providing hedgehog-friendly measures in their gardens. An ongoing study by the Zoological Society London (ZSL) shows that hedgehogs also thrive in wildlife-friendly gardens and allotments.

Our findings also show how installing wildlife-slow signage would be a prudent investment that aligns with Council strategy and policy and our

report makes recommendations on the most effective locations to install them.

What is more, wildlife-slow signage creates a unique identity for Flitwick as a town that values its wildlife.

If you find a hedgehog staggering around, lying still (not in a nest) with flies around it or spread out in the sun, or otherwise obviously sick or injured, use gardening gloves or a towel to gently pick it up, put it inside in a newspaper lined box, cover with a towel or fleece and offer some meaty cat or dog food and water. Once the hedgehog is settled, call the BHPS on 01584 890 801 or a vet for further advice.

Another range of local groups and organisations were successfully awarded April's round of the Town Council's Community Grants Awards for 2022 - 2023, all of which will provide support and opportunities for people living and working in the town.

Two teams of five swimmers in each team, in two separate lanes, were originally entered for a combined relay effort of 5000 metres (5k) per team. As they reached that point quite easily, unbeknown to the swimmers, we decided not to mention that they had reached their team 5k targets and got them to carry on swimming! So many wonderful people had made donations to the Just Giving page; having raised more than £1270 (£670 above target),

it was felt that it deserved a much longer swim by the Dolphins. Just another 20 minutes on and they managed to complete yet another 5k swim, meaning that each team of five swam a relay covering 10k.

The two teams actually swam a total of 20,000 metres to raise funds for Macmillan and Cancer Research.

Flittabus - Mid Beds Community Transport

Anybody can travel with Flittabus and if you have a bus pass they are accepted on all routes. The routes are designed to provide services to shops and town centres from village locations not well served by commercial bus companies.

Hi everyone, I'm Zöe, and I'm attempting a solo swim across the English Channel in August this year, in aid of Alzheimer's Research UK.

Having swum competitively as a child/teenager for Flitwick Dolphins way back in the 90s/early 2000s, and successfully completing a channel relay swim in 2019 raising over £10,000 for Autism Bedfordshire,

I'm now having a go at a solo crossing!

I've decided to swim for Alzheimer's Research UK. as I've experienced first-hand what this truly awful disease does to people - it steals them away from you, leaving a confused, upset and sometimes angry person who no longer knows who you or anyone else is. Having lost my nanna to this, and with another



family member diagnosed, it's something very close to my heart, and many other families across the UK.

I'll be swimming approximately 21 miles across the busiest shipping lane in the world, non-stop from Dover to France, in just a swimming costume, hat and goggles, aided by a support boat and crew, of which I cannot touch until I have successfully crossed the Channel. This could take me anywhere around 12-20 hours.
