After four years as a Councillor, this is my last 'Mayor's Welcome' before the local and parish elections on 4th May. I know I speak on behalf of all Councillors when I say it has been an honour to serve and represent our community. I've been pleased to represent Flitwick at many Bedfordshire events, including Ampthill, Dunstable, Houghton Regis, Leighton Buzzard, Sandy and Stotfold. I've also met with the Police & Crime Commissioner, Festus Akinbusoye, and I particularly enjoyed meeting Year 2 students at Flitwick Lower School to talk about the Council and the role of the Mayor.



We celebrated LGBTQ+ History Month for the first time, working with Ampthill Town Council and LGBT Bedfordshire under our Proud AF initiative to celebrate the contributions of LGBTQ+ residents to our community at our LGBTQ+ History Month Reception. It was also fantastic to meet so many of you at our Tree Giveaway, at various Coffee Mornings at the Village Hall and

to get your direct feedback via our Annual Resident Survey. The Annual Town Mayor's Quiz was won by the 'Dead Ducks', raising £853.54 for the Town Mayor's Charities.

A major focus for the Council has been to support residents with the rising cost of living, understanding the need in our community and implementing ideas that offer help at a local level. I've been very proud of our work setting up and running Flitwick Community Fridge, and I'm very grateful for the support of local businesses



and our very committed volunteers. It's not glamorous work collecting surplus food late at night, but it's been hugely rewarding.

We've also been working to advocate for solutions to fill the gap left by the recent Post Office closure and the upcoming closure of the Barclays Flitwick Branch. By securing an 'Access to Cash' Review with LINK, we've been able to lobby for a Banking Hub and ensure that decision-makers understand the needs of residents and local businesses.

Our upcoming events include something for everyone, including an Easter Egg Hunt, an Afternoon Tea to celebrate the King's Coronation, the return of the free Flitwick Family Fun Day and an Evening of Drag Entertainment! We're also in the middle of delivering some exciting projects, including lighting and CCTV at the Skate Park and heritage works at Manor Park.

Finally, I want to personally thank Cllr Ann Lutley, who is stepping down as a Councillor after thirty years of loyal service to our community. Always the first to volunteer and the last to leave, Ann's contribution to our Council, local charities, Flitwick Village Hall and our wider community is inspirational.

Exploring Feasibility Of A Banking Hub

Flitwick Town Councillors have been working to understand the needs of the community, including residents and local businesses, and the possibilities for filling the gaps left by the closure of the Post Office and the forthcoming closure of Barclays in Flitwick.

A Banking Hub is a dedicated and appropriate banking space where the public and businesses have daily access to face-to-face counter service, with the same transactional banking facilities that the high street banks offer.

Access to banking services is monitored and assessed by LINK on behalf of the banking industry, with LINK being able to order the delivery of services to address gaps in provision, including providing services like free-to-use

ATMs and Banking Hubs.

Flitwick Town Council and Ampthill Town Council are working together to lobby LINK to open a Banking Hub in our area. Delivering a Banking Hub is not within either Council's control, but Councillors recognise the important role they have to play in ensuring the needs of local communities are communicated.



Councillors across both Councils agree that securing a Banking Hub in either Flitwick or Ampthill town centres would be a significant win for our area.

A meeting was held in February to brief representatives from the Parish Councils representing the communities surrounding Flitwick and Ampthill about Banking Hubs and to ask for support lobbying LINK.

Councillors from Flitwick Town Council, Ampthill Town Council, Maulden Parish Council, Clophill Parish Council, Flitton & Greenfield Parish Council, Pulloxhill Parish Council, Steppingley Parish Council, Tingrith Parish Meeting, Millbrook Parish Meeting, and CBC Ward Councillors Mike Blair and Neil Bunyan all agreed support.

We have also met with representatives from LINK as part of its process to assess the needs of the community. Councillors discussed the information LINK collected through desk surveys, asked questions about the process, and clearly explained the gaps that not having access to banking will create. It is now down to LINK to make a final decision on need and viability. Whatever the outcome, we will keep you updated as this process progresses. The Town Council has been working to support residents with the cost of

living crisis in many different ways including a weekly warm space at The Hub, Dunstable Road, every Monday from 9.30am to 4.30pm. Visitors can stay all day or pop in for a few hours.

Flitwick Community Fridge

The Community Fridge is now up and running at The Rufus Centre. Open 8am to 8pm

during the week and 2pm on Saturdays, stock varies day to day. The Community Fridge has its own Facebook page so you can check on stock availability.

Free Community Events

Our fourth Free Community Movie Day takes place in the Easter holidays on **Tuesday 4th April**. We're busy choosing the films but we guarantee there'll be something for everyone! You'll be able to book free tickets via Eventbrite. Follow our social media for news on what's showing.

New Walk & Heritage Work At Manor Park

For over 12 months the Flitwick Parish Paths Partnership (P3) volunteers have been working with our Public Realm team to re-instate a circular pathway at Manor Park which has not been accessible for over 100 years!

The team have done a fantastic job, clearing a path through the wooded area adjacent to the roadway and building a new



bridge and boardwalk to open up the circular pathway. It really gives a whole new perspective of Manor Park.

Work has also started at Manor Park to repair and restore the South Gate and Piers (on the A5120 opposite Flitvale). One of the key elements of the Manor Park Heritage Project, the work will see the gates restored to their former glory.

The work is being funded by Central Bedfordshire Council Green Infrastructure Planning Obligations Funding.

Flitwick Bowls Club Centenary Year 1923-2023 A History of the Bowls Club

The birth of Flitwick Bowls Club in 1923 was the opening of a 3-rink green with a small wooden leanto which was situated in what is now the car park, in which players either changed their shoes or put on over shoes with flat soles.



As you stand in the car park looking towards the facilities now, the original green is the base of where our Clubhouse was built and when first opened had flower beds at the farthest end from the car park and along the side wall of Billingtons garage next door. When players were bowling on Rink 3, and they needed to bowl on the ditch side, the Skip would offer the advice for the amount of green to take for the wood of "bowl underneath the Lupins".

The other side of the green was closed in by a wire netting fence which separated the Bowling Green from the area occupied by the Tennis Courts. These were moved down to Windmill Road and that area was then transferred into the Green as you see it today and officially opened for play in 1976.

The Clubhouse was built with much of the work being done by the Club members and has been extended several times. In 1980 the Pavilion was cleared for use and in 1984 the Tennis Hut was cleared for Ladies meetings, needing a window, and our first Open Gala Day was held. In 1998 the ladies got their own changing room, and in recent years the Club has been almost completely refurbished to the wonderful standard we now enjoy.

The Club has had the honour of providing County Presidents for both men and women over the years; 5 Men's in 1973, 1985, 1993, 2015 and 2022; Women's in 1983 and 2018. John Goodman was also Eastern Counties President in 1973 and Rodney Hilliard became President for London & Southern Counties in 1999.

County Honours for the men were first achieved with winning the Harmsworth Cup in 1986 against Sandy Town BC. From 1986 to 1989 the Club also won the County League three times in four years, first against County Conservative BC followed by 2 victories over Queens Works BC.

A second victory in the Harmsworth Cup in 1994 against Eaton Socon was followed by the Runners-up title in the Pell Shield in 1997 against Cutler Hammer BC, by one shot.

The Ladies Section was formed in 1977 and had their first season in 1978. Our records show that 4 years later (1982) 8 ladies qualified for county matches and the East Beds & District League was started. In 1986 Peggy Gibbs was EBL President, in 2001 Lindon Gibson was EBL President and in 2012 Sandra Carson was EBL President.

The Ladies began to achieve various individual and county honours in 1989 and continue to do so today, as can be seen from the Honours Board that was created in 1984.

We have always enjoyed wonderful facilities provided by an ever-changing hard-working band of people throughout the years, such as the management committee, green keepers, gardeners, cleaners and many, many general helpers/volunteers. We are very proud of our Club which we are sure will go on from strength to strength for many more years to come. We look forward to welcoming new members and sharing our love for the game of bowls with them.

On Sunday 16th July Flitwick Bowls Club will be holding an Open Day for all the family. Everyone welcome.
