Meet Your New Town Councillors

We are delighted to welcome three new Town Councillors to Flitwick Town Council: Tina Connell, Toby Harald and Robert Wilsmore.

There was no election required for Flitwick Town Councillors in the Parish Elections held on 4th May as the Flitwick East and Flitwick West wards were uncontested. The total number of Flitwick Town Councillors is now 14.

Councillor Connell has lived in Flitwick for over 30 years and works for the Co-op in Flitwick. She is a Member Pioneer for the Co-op helping local charities, and is a director of a CIC Saturday Outreach Service, feeding and supporting the homeless and in need.

Married with five daughters, Councillor Harald works as a contractor for various businesses around the UK. "I'm a relatively recent arrival to Flitwick, so I am looking forward to finding out more about the Flitwick community and its needs and concerns, and how the Town Council can help with those."

Commenting on his appointment, Councillor Wilsmore said: "I first moved to Flitwick in 1961 and have seen it transformed from a village into a small town. I am committed to protecting Flitwick from over development and maintaining and improving the green spaces and bio-diversity in and around the town."

Annual Assembly

The Annual Assembly in May provided an opportunity for the Town Council to talk about what's been achieved in the past 12 months, plans for the future, and an overview of the second Annual Residents' Survey.

Cash Access UK Chief Operating Officer, Cat Farrow, joined us for the evening to talk about plans

for the new Banking Hub in Ampthill.

The Town Council has been working together with Ampthill Town Council, surrounding Parish Councils and local campaigners to lobby LINK to open a Banking Hub in the area. LINK announced in March that a Banking Hub had been commissioned in Ampthill, to be delivered by Cash Access UK.





A site has been identified and the plan is for the Banking Hub to be open within 9 months.

£7,150 Raised For Town Mayor's Charities!

For residents struggling to feed their pets, we have partnered with the RSPCA to offer food for cats, dogs, rabbits and guinea pigs, available for collection from The Rufus Centre during office hours.

In addition, we are providing support for anyone looking for employment or a change of career with a new twice monthly Job Club at The Hub. We offer help with a range of things including CV writing, job applications and interview techniques.

Manor Park Entrance Transformed

An amazing transformation has taken place at The South Gate entrance to Manor Park (on the A5120 opposite Nuyard Garden Centre).

One of the key elements of the Manor Park Heritage Project was to restore the South Gate and Piers to their former glory. We are delighted that this work was completed in May, just in time for a special guided walk through the park as part of the Greensand Country Festival.

Original materials have been used where possible. The bridge has been repaired with matching heritage bricks, and the gate piers have been rebuilt using the original bricks and stone cappings. The black railings are the original ones that have been partially restored too.

The project has been funded by Central Bedfordshire Council's Green

Infrastructure Planning Obligations Funding.

We hope everyone will enjoy using the new grand entrance to the park!

This summer you can also explore Manor Park via the new circular walkway, reinstated after more than 100 years by the Flitwick Parish Paths Partnership (P3) volunteers working together with our Public Realm Team.

Manor Park features on the Flit Valley Walk, a route that follows the River Flit through its quiet valley rich in history and wildlife and includes Flitwick Moor Nature Reserve and Flitton Moor.

Nicky was also actively involved in helping to open the first two Squirrel Dreys in the county.

Nicky is a qualified archery instructor and holds a permit for narrow boating. She has supervised many archery sessions at camps and has taken several Scouts narrow boating for a weekend on the Grand Union Canal. She has also helped to plan and run camps and sleepovers; these have included family camps



that over 250 adults, young people and children attended.

Nicky was a foster carer for several years and looked after many children aged from 2 to 16, including a group of four children. She 'retired' as a foster carer last year and now spends some of her 'spare' time as a volunteer at The Stables in Milton Keynes.

Nicky said: "I volunteer because I get to work with other amazing adults who work tirelessly to provide a variety of exciting, fun activities. Offering 'first time experiences' such as helping a Beaver Scout to toast a marshmallow over an open fire, encouraging a Cub Scout to get to the top of a climbing wall, or helping a Scout steer a twelve-berth narrow boat for the first time is all part of nurturing a 'can do' attitude for the young people."

Tracey said, "My son Josh was a Beaver and a Cub and is now a Scout. Nicky provided him and his friends with so many fantastic experiences. Hundreds of children have benefitted from Nicky's commitment and dedication to Scouts."

Nicky was invited to the Coronation Concert at Windsor Castle on 7th May and will receive a pin badge and a certificate signed by both of Their Majesties.



Repairing and Sharing - Coming To Flitwick

SHARE: FLITWICK AND AMPTHILL successfully staged their first Repair Café at Ampthill Parkside Hall at the end of April.

Residents turned out in force to have a range of broken items repaired by a team of willing volunteer repairers. The skilled team managed to repair over 85% of items that were booked in including air fryers, cycles, clocks, childhood toys, vacuum cleaners and pressure washers.

Total donations on the day towards the cost of the hall rental, and the drinks and cakes provided, ensured the charity broke even, enabling a number of future events to be possible in 2023.

On the day there was also a range of additional stalls providing information, advice, and products for sale, themed around environmental issues and sustainability.


