### **Tiny Forest Takes Shape in Hinksley Park**

In February, volunteers braved the elements to help plant trees for the first Tiny Forest in Flitwick at Hinksley Road Recreation Ground. Tiny Forests are dense and fast-growing native woodland created from up to 600 native trees planted in an area the size of a tennis court. Funded by Central Bedfordshire Council

via the Local Authority Treescapes Fund (LATF), and delivered by environmental charity Earthwatch Europe, Tiny Forests help mitigate the impact of climate change and provide a natural habitat for wildlife that can attract over 500 animal and plant species within the first 3 years.





#### **Community Tree Planting at Nature Park**

There was a fantastic turnout at the Community Tree Planting event at the Nature Park, Maulden Road. This work is part of our plans to transform the site into a park for the benefit of the local community.

Incredibly, with the help of volunteers and support of the Forest of Marston Vale, over 2,000 trees were planted. Flitwick Scout Group came back the following evening to plant 100 trees too. We are very grateful to everyone who came along for their support and can't wait to see the Nature Park flourish.

There will be further opportunities for the local community to get involved. Watch this space!
