New Town Mayor Elected

Councillor John Roberts was elected Town Mayor at the Annual Statutory Meeting in May. Councillor Roberts will be supported during the 2024/25 civic year by Councillor Martin Platt who was elected Deputy Town Mayor.

New Focal Point for Town Centre

Plans are underway to transform 3 Station Road (the former Barclays Bank building) into a two-story restaurant and adjacent retail unit. The project recently received a funding boost of £384,000 following two successful grant applications.

The building was purchased by the Town Council in November 2021 as an investment, primarily to secure the frontage as a Town Square for community use and to prevent the rest of the site from being lost to residential development.

Our vision will see the building fully renovated and reconfigured to provide space for a casual dining restaurant in the two-storey section and a single-storey retail unit. Modern glazing will replace the old façade, and the layout will be modified to become fully accessible. There will also be more investment into the Town Square to enable the area at the front of the building to be used for outdoor dining during the summer months.



We will also work with Post Office Ltd to explore how best to restore a post office counter to the town as part of this project, which we know is high on the list of priorities for residents and businesses.

Work is now underway on detailed designs and planning for the project, which is being managed by Luton Borough Council's Design & Delivery Service. We expect to submit a formal planning application in the next couple of months and will keep residents informed of progress on this exciting development, which will provide a fantastic centrepiece for the town centre.

Fundraising Success

£3,355.71 was donated to Tibbs Dementia Foundation towards providing services in the local area. Tibbs do fantastic work in our community with services ranging from vital carers support groups to the amazing 'Music 4 Memory' sessions.

SOS Saturday Outreach Service provide a free meal service for people who are homeless or in need. Volunteers cook and serve a hot meal and also offer clothing and food. £2,200.52 was donated which will help cover running costs and pay for equipment.

Registered charity, Flitwick Village Hall, is run by volunteers and is fundraising for a new roof. A cheque was presented at the AGM for £500 towards the appeal. You can find out more about the fundraising appeal on page 18.

The Flitwick Community Fridge has continued to grow, meeting record demand from residents needing support with the high cost of living while also helping to reduce food waste. Regular users will have noticed that food supply has been highly variable since Christmas and that we've been battling to secure stock, forcing our volunteers to drive further and increasing our running costs.

In May, we recorded 443 visits to the fridge and redistributed 1.8 tonnes of food to residents from Flitwick and the surrounding area.

In addition to our regular collections from Aldi, Co-op, Waitrose and SOFEA, we're delighted and hugely grateful for the support we're receiving from Tesco Flitwick, which is supporting our service as a local community initiative. We are particularly grateful to Lyn and Mary, the local Tesco Community Champions, for being the driving force behind this and for regularly delivering food to The Rufus Centre themselves.

The Community Fridge is currently open at The Rufus Centre Monday to Friday between 9am and 5pm and Saturdays from 9.30am to 11.30am. Be sure to follow Flitwick


