Summer has been a busy time in Flitwick with lots of great events for everyone to enjoy. The largest was the Family Fun Day which drew even bigger crowds this year proving its popularity. A big thank you to everyone who helped organise and support the Fun Day and made it such a great event.

Jim Snook and colleagues also deserve special praise for organising another successful Flitwick Car Show at which I (along with hundreds of other petrol heads) had a great time indulging our passion for cars, trucks and motorbikes.





Thanks to funding from the National Lottery, Flitwick Town Council was pleased to be able to offer a programme of free activities during the school holidays which included a Circus Skills Workshop, Adult and Child Cookery Sessions, Mini Olympics, Street Dance, Build a Bug Hotel, and a Graffiti Workshop.

Over 660 parents and children attended so many thanks to staff and volunteers for organising these events and, of course, to those who attended (especially the young people who I had the pleasure of meeting at the Graffiti workshop).

As you will see later in this edition, Patricia Earles has been co-opted as a new Councillor. Patricia was previously a Councillor for 4 years and it's great to have her back.

Coming up in the autumn we have a Coffee Morning and Quiz being held in aid of my two charities, Keech Hospice Care and the Flitwick Town Mayor's Charity Community Fund. It would be great to see residents coming along to support these events and helping raise as much money as we can for these worthy causes.

The Community Fridge has moved to its new dedicated home, to the side of The Rufus Centre. It continues to do great work with now 29 volunteers who last month distributed enough food to make almost 1800 meals. Most of this food would previously have been wasted but now helps those people in our community who are still struggling to meet everyday living expenses. As ever a huge thank you to the volunteers, staff and the local food suppliers for making it such a success.

Station Road Update

New Town Centre Focal Point Moves a Step Closer

At the end of July, the Town Council formally submitted a planning application for its flagship project to transform 3 Station Road, the former Barclays Bank building, into a two-storey casual dining restaurant and a retail space. Plans to modernise and upgrade the building's



frontage will enhance the town centre, and the restaurant will bring a new business to Flitwick, offering an exciting, new casual dining experience for residents and visitors.

A core aim of the project is to see the return of a post office counter to the town as part of the retail offering. While not guaranteed, the Council has been working with Post

Office Ltd to ensure the retail space meets the requirements of any business operating a post office counter. We anticipate that the process of advertising to commercial tenants will begin in the New Year.

You can view and comment on the plans on Central Bedfordshire Council's planning portal Ref: CB/24/02184/FULL. Alternatively, scan the QR code to go straight to the page. In the meantime, you will notice work commencing on replacing the roof of the building as phase one of the construction work begins.

The original surveys completed at the time of the original purchase of the site showed the roof required replacement. The building has suffered from water ingress and these works will make the building watertight and drastically improve energy efficiency.

This work is funded by the UK Government's Community Ownership fund, with work commencing now to comply with the grant funding requirements. Following a full tender process, the Council is delighted to announce that the roof works contract has been awarded to Flitwick-based Accurate Flat Roofing.

Grant funding kick starts Flitwick Living History project

An exciting project to create an interactive website that will document the people, places and events which relate to the Flitwick area is now underway thanks to £24,500 received from the UK government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF).



The first part of the project is to train a dozen volunteers in how to interview, record and edit the oral history of key long-term residents. As part of the wider project, we are looking for people of all ages, backgrounds and interests to get involved in shaping, creating and managing content that will eventually be available on the website.

The aim is to document the social history of Flitwick through the people, organisations and events that shaped our community and to create the opportunity for residents, local businesses and other groups or organisations to add their own content to the website.



There are lots of ways to get involved with the project going forward, from testing the concept website, writing copy, collecting content, and moderating memories through to uploading and managing social media promotion.

Community Fridge

Community Fridge Moves to New Food Hub

The Flitwick Community Fridge has moved (not far!) into dedicated space at The Rufus Centre. Our new Food Hub offers lots more space for this increasingly popular service with a direct entrance from the car park to make access easier. We now have a much larger stock room, including commercial fridges, allowing us to increase capacity to meet demand. We've also been pleased to support St George's Church in Toddington to run a weekly pop-up food stall on Saturday mornings known as Toddington Community Fridge!

The Food Hub has been made possible thanks to generous financial support from organisations and local businesses, including Hubbub, Techcite Ltd, Central Bedfordshire Council Ward Councillor Grants, Pyrolec Ltd and Tesco Flitwick.

Our amazing team of 29 volunteers work tirelessly for this community project doing a fantastic job collecting surplus food and ensuring the fridge is fully staffed during opening hours to serve the community.



In August, we redistributed an amazing 5,120 kg of food and recorded 1,483 visits to the fridge, including 29 people visiting

for the first time. We're particularly grateful to our community partner Tesco



Flitwick, which has supported the Council's Summer Programme on top of daily food donations to Flitwick Community Fridge.

Everyone is welcome to visit the Community Fridge regardless of circumstances; we are here to help reduce food waste and provide support for anyone struggling with the high cost of food. All food shared by our project is free, but we'd be very grateful for small donations to help us cover the cost of the remaining items we need for the Food Hub.

In addition to our regular offer, we are now providing a new service on Friday nights aimed at reducing food waste. We're now open on Fridays between 9.15pm and 9.45pm to share food we have collected from Tesco Flitwick and Waitrose Ampthill that has to be used on the same day.

We don't know in advance what food or how much we will have until we collect. Recently we have had a selection of sushi, prepared fruit, ready meals, dairy and limited meat and fish.
