1371. MINUTES

It was **RESOLVED** to adopt the minutes from the Community Services meeting held on Tuesday 3rd March 2026 as an accurate record of the meeting.

1372. MATTERS ARISING

a. Minutes of the Community Services Committee Meeting on **Tuesday 3rd March 2026.**

There were no matters arising.

1373. ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION

a. CERT Working Group

The Chairman asked if the plan needed approval in principle or delegation for correction in the future. Cllr Hart advised Members that the CERT Working group were looking for approval of the structure of the document. The document had been created in line with CBC's template, which was used for other CERT's in Bedfordshire.

Members discussed the equipment list and asked officers if there enough storage in the Tractor Store for this equipment.

Cllr Hart advised Members that the CERT would require somebody to lead the team in an emergency, and advised that it would be good to have somebody with experience. Cllr Wilsmore had been suggested given his background in the Police but this would be discussed further at the next CERT working group meeting.

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the CERT plan in principle and approve the list of items to be taken forward for grant funding.

b. Memorial Bench Request – Manor Park

Members commented that the bench policy needed updating to control things such as plastic flowers being cable tied to benches etc. Officers would be presenting a revised policy to the June Meeting.

Members asked about the Hemlock on site and what is being done to control this. Officers agreed to seek some specialist advice on this matter.

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the bench application and the location.

1374. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION

a. Officer Update

(i) Members to note the Amenities Officer update.

Members were pleased to see the 'Safer Play' app being used to record all maintenance for play areas. The Chairman had been reflecting on comments at the Annual Assembly and felt that more proactive communication could be done with what we do with play areas. For example, if a piece of equipment is looking tired, it doesn't necessarily mean it requires replacement.

Action: Amenities Officer/Communication & Marketing Manager

A Member asked if the funding for the Ornamental Bridge at Manor Park had been removed. The Town Clerk advised that the funding for the bridge was no longer available, as the money was used on the gate only due to the increase in

build/material costs at the time.

The Town Clerk advised that the Nature Park planning application had been paused as there were due to be some changes from the government on how BNG is applied, meaning the Nature Park would be exempt. This would remove the associated costs with a section 106 for BNG and a 30 year financial commitment for monitoring. The risk of pausing the application was that the planning obligation section 106 funding that was currently earmarked for the Nature Park was now at risk. Officers were continuing to liaise with CBC on getting the date extended or alternatively, identifying another project the costs could be used for.

The Amenities Officer wanted to highlight the recent Fun Fair and Flitwick 10k that was held at Millennium Park. Both of which were hugely successful; however, the race director for Flitwick 10k had raised some concerns about the amount of space the fun fair took up. The Amenities Officer advised Members that this was likely to be raised at a future meeting.

Members asked how flexible the dates were for both the Fun Fair and the 10k race. The Amenities Officer advised that both dates seemed to be set in stone, with the Fun Fair already being booked for 2027. Members believed that bookings were on a first-come, first-served basis, and if they were to both be held on the same day, mutual arrangements would need to be made.

Members wanted to comment on what a fantastic job the Public Realm team are doing and commented that lots of places around Flitwick were looking very well kept, and it was clear what a big difference was being made. Specific comments around the burial ground and the work at the entrance were noted. Members agreed the Town looked cleaner as a result of this.

(ii) Members to note the Community Services update.

Members felt that the feedback from the easter egg hunt felt like a generous interpretation of challenges, given how quickly the easter eggs and colouring competition ran out. Officers commented that they did the best they could in the situation, and ways to improve this were being explored for the future. Members commented that the event seemed to be advertised quite widely, and the Town Clerk commented that a 'what's on' Facebook group for Bedfordshire had picked the event up and shared this, which attracted people from outside the area.

Members also commented that it could be an idea to have a QR code for the answer sheet as opposed to paper copies, as this would avoid them running out.

Members were again reminded of the Family Fun Day and asked to look out for an email in need of help on the day, which would be sent out shortly by officers.

Correspondence from Flitwick 10K – Community Services 02.06.2026

Thank you very much for inviting Ampthill & Flitwick Flyers Running Club to the Mayor's Dinner earlier this month. We had a very enjoyable evening and it was great to meet other community groups and hear about those who have served Flitwick for so many years.

Richard and I raised a couple of challenges we face with the Flitwick 10k and you asked me to follow up with an email.

As background, the Flitwick 10k was established in 1989. The race now attracts over 800 runners annually, attracting runners from across the East and South East, and with a significant proportion coming from the local area. As a club we cater for over 300 members from the local community.

The race enables us to operate as a club, providing training and races for our members and to make a charitable donation. The charity is selected by our members and in the past two years donations of over £5,000 have been made to Above and Beyond (Central Beds breast cancer support group) and Appledown (dog rescue).

As you know the race finishes on Millennium Green and we hire this from the Town Council for the day. For a number of years, we have had to share the area with the visiting fair. Whilst they are cooperative, over the years, the fair has expanded significantly and the available space has been reduced further by extension of the skatepark. This means we now barely have enough room on the Millennium Green to accommodate our finish and runners/spectators. It certainly detracts from the experience runners have and their impression of Flitwick.

In previous years, we have been charged a community rate, effectively half price. For this year, the Town Council decided to increase this to the full rate. So, we have a double whammy of reducing space and increasing prices, which impacts both the quality of the event we provide and the experience of those attending.

Our ideal would be not to have to share with the fair. We have an established date in the regional racing calendar so changing the date (other than by a week either side) is not really an option. We would also ask that the Town Council reconsiders the fee charged for this event as paying full rate when we have to share and have a reducing amount of space does not seem fair.

Events and Activities

- I think more local events could take place which include the whole community especially with the size of Millennium Park and the Facilities at The Rufus Centre.
- There could be more variety of activities to enable socialising out of office hours to allow those at work to participate, between 5pm and 9pm and weekends.
- More events for teenagers.
- Please more events and activities for other areas of the community. I think there is a lot at the hub at the park for young people. It would be nice for activities for adults and for older people.
- The Family Fun Day is something that we look forward to every year. We come to the main park for all the events that happen there, like the circus, the fun fair, and the Flitwick 10k Race.
- The family events in the park by Tesco and the food events are very enjoyable. We need better security in town.
- The family day and cinema events are great!
- Car show Halloween trail are great - rufus events too far out of town centre.
- The Family Fun Day is great and the lights switch on. But there is a lot we don't have any more like the scarecrow competition, and town sale. The summer activities are good for children but older people 50 plus there is nothing and for seniors there was a lot of great community feeling with monthly lunches and Christmas, but it all went with no real conversation about it and what alternatives could be. It was good for people who live on their own. Please do more for this group of people.
- Christmas tree works well. Community events tend to be aimed at children - need more for all ages
- Car show, Halloween trial are great.
- Apart from the leisure centre of which you need to be a member...where can you go as a family? No where locally.
- Community events provided are good but maybe more varied events could be considered.
- There needs to be more activities for the younger population. Stop them from doing reckless things given them a purpose.
- Youth clubs and youth facilities would be nice.
- Cinema events, eat feast, skate park, comedy nights, crafts and other activities put on in the day are all good. What isn't working so well is the time some of those activities are on, it can mean many working people don't have options to join in, unless they book time off of work.
- More family seasonal events and also more spaces for small children. The town needs indoor play areas for children.
- Activities/clubs etc for younger people teenagers etc.

- The programme of community events have been really refreshing and great to see. I think that Flitwick and the local area is currently missing an area where non-profits can organise events that benefit the local community - a shared community space or similar. It would also be great to have a men's (person's?) shed available.
- The Council do a lot more than other councils with similar population and we are grateful for that. We would like to see more activities for people whose children have left home - not youngsters. There is a lot going on for them which is great. Middle aged people like us would like more.
- A splash park would be a brilliant addition like the one in Leighton Buzzard and Dunstable.
- More for the older children, there only seems to be the hub.
- Sorry to see the rides not being free for children at the last Family Funeral Day. It was the year before and I'm sure would have been much appreciated by families.
- From when I first moved here - in 2004 - the town council has introduced community events that seem special to Flitwick, and improve the community feel, including the community fun day, Easter trail, Halloween trail, car show, and Christmas lights turn on. I would like to see the gardens competition reinstated.
- There should be more activities in the village hall, which is a lot more easy to access for most residents than is the Rufus Centre.
- Range of activities is very good.
- The family fun day is the best event of the year.
- We feel as a family we are lucky to have a town where there are things happening but we would like to see more free events, more for older people like my parents there does not seem to be much going on for them on a regular basis. It would be nice if they had somewhere to meet and socialise.
- Utilise the Hub more for cultural and family events. The play parks could be updated and improved upon, especially the play park on Hatfield Road. Picnic tables for young families to meet up and eat outdoors, especially in Millennium Park and other play parks. Green spaces need to be maintained regularly.
- The FUNDAY is very good.
- Family fun day .and Christmas and Remembrance Day are well organised and deserve credit.
- Family fun day in summer is always enjoyable. Maybe something else, like a walking or friendship group for the "young retired".
- The events held at the Millennium park are usually excellent.
- Family day in June is a great community event, so is the car show and the Halloween trail. More community events like this would be good.
- It would be nice to have events for different ages and regular activities for all ages. In the past I came to outdoor circuits free of charge which was great as I could not justify cost of doing this at a gym. The Family fun day is good for the community.
- The council appears to spend a great deal of time supporting items such as Share Flitwick, the community fridge - perhaps it needs to realise the majority of residents do not care about this.

- You have a large majority of well earning residents who your services do not appeal to, having attending a children event at the Rufus, I thought it was a complete waste of money by the council and the team involved did not care about the kids.
- Family fun day is great event, would be good to see more artisan stalls/food stands. The bar area can get a little “adult” at times.
- More available to everyone. More advertising of events. The Rufus Centre is quite far away for lots of people (who don't drive), so maybe alternative places for things.
- I work full-time time and rarely use facilities in Flitwick. My only feedback was that my elderly mother was excluded from dementia group as I couldn't stay there due to working. While I understand the SG aspect, it is a barrier to many attending.
- More activities available for young people.
- We no longer have events like Street food heroes visiting regularly and are instead limited to a smaller volume of similar events through the summer. Not sure what has happened to scare them off.
- I think the yearly car event is good, something for everyone.
- The main events like family fun day are good. We used to have the monthly eat feast style event at Millennium which was good but they seem to have stopped. This brought people together. Like the scarecrow festival as well. Be good to have more events for all ages to get involved.
- The summer event, easter egg hunt. Things that bring the community together.
- I love that the local council provides Easter egg hunts, family fun days and services like the community fridge. Would like more events on such as charity bingo, horse racing again (we loved the screens and guessing).
- Days like family fun day are fantastic.
- A good range of activities that are well promoted and supported.
- The fun day is good just a shame the rides became paid for and last year were cash only - taking card payments the fair that provided them make you pay extra so £2.50 cash bit £4/£5 if paying by card.
- The Easter egg hunt was over by 10:30 this year there was no eggs which would not have deterred us from participating but they couldn't give us any map or details of what to look out for - it was basically a walk in the woods with a possibility of seeing someone from the leisure centre dressed as a bee. I think a paid event like an Easter party would work better as then it's documented who is coming and how many and will keep it local as some people in the queue near us came from near Milton Keynes to attend.
- Family fun days are brilliant gets the whole community involved. Maybe schools should be included more, like they use to do the carnival floats.
- Family fun day is basically provided by local charitable organisations with little finance or input from the town council other than the basics e.g. toilets and P A system and the town council gazebo .
- Car show , fairly good event, poorly organised, needs a committee to run it correctly. Seem to be some other rather strange events going on, closed shop job.
- Need more for teenagers.
- The annual events are always very good, i.e. the family fun day, the car show, the Christmas lights switch on. The activity programmes that are put on for the children and

families are excellent e.g. the various sports, the circus skills, African drumming etc. The venues used at The Hub, The Rufus Centre and the parks are great. The Easter egg hunt and scarecrow and Halloween trails are very well run. The litter picks and fun run are very good. I think that more advertising of what's on in all of Flitwick is needed. You have some excellent groups and events, but people are not always aware of what is happening. Is there a way of advertising what's on?

- Location wise the rufus centre is on the extreme edge of town. More. Plus be helpful over town. Easier to access.
- We like the family fun day. Although it was better when it was free for us as we have a low income.
- Great Events in the Park (car show etc)- great
- The family fun day in millennium Park is brilliant and brings family and friends together without it costing a fortune.
- I would like to see more for older people - people without children. The youth activities I see look good but do not apply to us.
- Christmas lights and FFD good community events. We need more. More activities for all ages.
- Anything that brings the community together is good but we still don't have a heart of the town.
- The Fun day is too expensive, expensive food expensive rides, pointless really.
- The council have a good programme in the summer but there are gaps for middle age and older regular activities or support for things like men's in sheds.
- So many activities that are advertised are just for children.
- Community facilities & events are better than most towns have available.
- Ran out of Easter eggs. Rides are too expensive.
- We love the family fun day, however we believe people from outside of Flitwick attend making it feel quite chaotic and not a event for us residents. Maybe a ticketed/wristband system. We also love the cinema days at the Rufus Centre.
- More activities for preschool and under.
- If it was not for the like of Jim Snook there would not be any activities.
- Would like to see more activities in the centre of town, more for all ages – community picnics with live music with local talent.
- There is no way for anyone to come forward to organise anything. One must already have links to or be art of the council to be able to do or organise anything like this. The council website is also confusing and hard to navigate so information on what's happening is hard to find when pages aren't maintained and are containing irrelevant or outdated information about what's on. Not everyone has Facebook. Stop acting like everyone does. The community boards around town are great, but they don't get updated often enough in my opinion.
- Communication via "Flitwick Papers" is excellent and very informative and should be supported ongoing. Rufus Centre Activities as re improved and appealing more to all age groups. Rendezvous Cafe is excellent and possibility could be publicised more widely. Also, the FUNDAY is very good. There is a large amount of emphasis on the Community

Fridge - is this too much? Could more be done for the older age groups on a regular basis at the Rufus Centre.

- More summer events would be nice at the parks or at the rufus centre field -picnics with live music. Events that don't cost a lot to attend.
- Lot of emphasis on children and young people which is good for families but it would be good to have more for different ages - over 30s without families or just want time away from children – mindfulness.
- Community events bring people together. It would be good to see the scarecrow competition and front garden competitions back as that gets people involved. The Hub looks like it is derelict from the outside but it is in a good location so could be a good venue for those people who can't travel easily to Rufus centre We love Family day at the park.
- We need more community spaces that people actually want to us and are suitable.
- . Love the Halloween and Christmas activities so please keep them up! And our Remembrance Events are excellent
- There is NOTHING on for young adults, excluding the odd craft club. There's no support to my knowledge for trying to get a club or meet off the ground. I, personally have ambitions for a few meets/clubs for the local area that could bring quite a positive change which is much needed to Flitwick. Perhaps the council could buy out the to let space at the Russell centre and allow people to hold club meetings and small gatherings there (the rufus centre charging £110 for their minimum price is unacceptable and not appropriate either for this type of thing.) because there's no space for holding small club gatherings in the local area. We need that.
- We are pleased with what council does for the community and our school keeps us informed of what's happening in parent mail. I am involved with local group and we feel included and supported. We use the website to add our events - it would be good to see some of councillors around at different things.
- Perhaps the council could buy out the to let space at the Russell centre and allow people to hold club meetings and small gatherings there (the rufus centre charging £110 for their minimum price is unacceptable and not appropriate either for this type of thing.) because there's no space for holding small club gatherings in the local area. We need that. So many people are struggling during this time of cost of living soaring and stupid wars breaking out every other day. Everything is exhausting. Let us create spaces for ourselves and others for reprieve. Flitwick needs more "third places" which aren't cafes that close at 5pm. The things that do exist heavily favour business or those with expendable income to throw away on a four hour slot at the Rufus centre for over a hundred pounds.
- Promote all community events to all groups to encourage everybody's involvement.
- Litter picks and youth activities needed.
- More events done nearer the centre of the village (town),
- Happy with regular booklets and events/clubs happening in area. Should be more presence in schools to increase awareness; more litter picking/community events/ joint school events/ children learning about resources, opportunities to learn or share time with older people, charities in the area, communal walks etc.

- Include plans for older generation, seems all factored around children and making money for FTC. For example, Rufus Cafés prices are now just as expensive as anywhere else where it used to feel cheaper than a good place to go value for money, just seems to be FTC cashing in.
- Perhaps encourage people to a steering committee for community events. Encourage the young, old and LGBT communities to be a part of any steering/organising group.
- Have better community/family activities and places to go, not a coffee shop. Where kids can interact indoors.
- More community use of the reck would be nice. Maybe more things aimed at adults.
- Have better community/family activities and places to go, not a coffee shop. Where kids can interact indoors.
- Honestly it is pretty good - we need to look at what we spend and the number of people it will affect rather than constantly using money to assist ever smaller groups within the area.
- More events for residents to get together. Create groups and share ideas.
- Celebrating more the difference of our community.
- The Council try hard to provide activities and events for families. There are lots of older people too. They also like to attend events, but we get events for the elderly. I don't class myself as elderly. I am in years, but not in my head!
- There used to be regular litter picking groups around town. Another "saving" which leaves the whole town a scruffy, untidy mess. Hedges verges as well as litter , never mind the abandoned dog poo bags everywhere. I don't feel part of any community anymore!
- It would be lovely to have a Flitwick in bloom competition to encourage residents to enter.
- I think more could be done to help families with SEND children and young people as an inclusion aim.
- Make more clubs or social events on regular basis for adults with special needs, such as Lego and jigsaw club for adults with needs not children, different clubs for children.
- Hold more things in the centre of Flitwick.
- Offer more opportunities to showcase the local business and farms and local producers.
- Maybe projects could be run to bring older generations together with the children maybe through the schools, hub, and voluntary organisations like scouts etc. Flitwick has nothing for the vast SEN population and d separately needs something.
- When asked about what clubs / support (free) there is for new mums / parents, there is nothing provided and no guidance given. Given the major cost of living crisis this is just ridiculous.
- More activities for children with send and young people 16-19 as there isn't much available.
- Lack of thought for events and use of space.
- I have lived here 30yrs and you have yet to offer a service or event that has enticed me to participate. I feel the voice of residents is not heard or dismissed.

- Spaces need to be offered for people to access and meet for required purposes. That might be: bring any craft and chat over coffee, a book club, a well-being and reflection group, topic based discussion groups. British Sign Language, baby sign language and Makaton might interest some people.
- Activities should be rotated in order to keep them fresh and interesting. Board games and puzzles, chair based exercise to music, chair yoga and gentle stretching, ballon volleyball, tea dances. trivia nights, coffee mornings are just some suggestions. It would be wonderful to create a communal sensory garden that is developed by people in the community working alongside the council gardeners. However, it needs to be in a place that won't be vandalised. A garden with a bench provides a quiet, peaceful area for contemplation. It could be a memorial garden. I hope that the crematorium will also have a memorial garden.
- Wider range of events and spaces that aren't just sport or for children.
- Re-instate a SEND youth group at The Hub. There used to be one then it was shut down.

Activities for Older People

- We miss the regular activities for older people. It was a lifeline for older people on their own and the sense of community in Flitwick for older people has gone. We miss it. We hope you bring it back. There is nothing for us apart from knitting and fitness group. That's not inclusive.
- I think there should be more activities for older people. There used to be various things that older citizens could attend however many of these have now stopped which is rather disappointing as it is a great way to socialise.
- Older People Activities
- Include plans for older generation, seems all factored around children and making money for FTC.
- More events for older people.
- They stopped the meals even though we paid for them ourselves. we miss the Christmas meal. We don't see people anymore and if affected a lot of people who don't see anyone from day to day. Please bring something back. It was always popular and there was no consultation.
- There is no OAP community meals including the Christmas meal. This brought the community together and a lot of people miss this social event. This gave people a purpose and got them out of the house especially important for people living alone.
- More activities to bring older people together, especially on their own who are lonely. A lunch club or coffee morning in a warm safe environment.
- My only feedback was that my elderly mother was excluded from dementia group as I couldn't stay there due to working. While I understand the SG aspect, it is a barrier to many attending.
- More regular activities for older people.
- More recognition for the older community.
- Could more be done for the older age groups on a regular basis at the Rufus Centre.
- More for older people like my parents there does not seem to be much going on for them on a regular basis. It would be nice if they had somewhere to meet and socialise.

- Please more events and activities for other areas of the community. I think there is a lot at the hub at the park for young people. It would be nice for activities for adults and for older people.
- I think there should be more activities for older people. There used to be various things that older citizens could attend however many of these have now stopped which is rather disappointing as it is a great way to socialise.
- The summer activities are good for children but older people 50 plus there is nothing and for seniors there was a lot of great community feeling with monthly lunches and Christmas, but it all went with no real conversation about it and what alternatives could be. - I was disappointed when the monthly lunch for older residents was discontinued. Other establishments run such events at a similar cost to the town council. It was an opportunity to meet different people and that has been lost.
- Hardly any activities for older people now. Used to have lunch club and various clubs for the older generation, however due to cost cutting these have been scrapped. They are very much missed.
- You do nothing for the older people that don't have kids.
- Very disappointed that the council took away the grant from bi monthly tea dance that used to take place at the Rufus Centre. Seem to cater more for younger population of Flitwick.
- I would like to see more for older people - people without children. The youth activities I see look good but do not apply to us.
- The council have a good programme in the summer but there are gaps for middle age and older regular activities or support for things like men's in sheds.
- I make sure I am only in and around Flitwick when I need to be and then at home to be as safe as possible as I have a young family. We do not attend anything social anymore and keep ourselves away from events or even accessing local amenities.

The Hub

- More info about hub; can be a bit intimidating when don't know much about it.
- The Hub should offer longer operating hours after school.
- The Hub should be open more often with availability for all when younger people aren't using it
- The Hub isn't somewhere we go because we don't have teenage children (our kids are much younger), but it is in a central location where you could do more, not just for the youth. We once went to a pumpkin carving event in the garden there, which was really good - I think the Council organised this event - maybe you could do more for families there.
- The Hub needs more publicity.
- Facilities at The Hub are basic. It's cold and the chairs are uncomfortable and you can't see out. I use it because I am part of a group. Wish there was somewhere nicer to go, but after over 13 years of using the Rufus Centre we were asked to leave. We knit for charities.
- The Hub is drastically under used.

- The Youth option at the hub was ruined by the change of supplier.
- Last time I saw the hub open at the park was probably 10 years ago around the time it opened, it should be used as a resource for young adults as there's no more third spaces available anywhere, especially Flitwick located in the countryside where you need to drive or use public transport to do anything.
- The hub is amazing but only operates 1 x day per week. The young people need more structured places to go like the hub daily. No facilities for SEN children at all within the village.
- The Hub is never open.
- I think more could be done at The Hub for all ages as it is tin centre of town.
- The Hub youth club is fantastic, and it would be great if it was open on more days.
- Hub needs to be open more. Whenever it is open it's only for older children like year 5 onwards. Can we not have something more for younger ones too.
- The hub needs. Wider usage and explained what's it's for. It's a drab toilet block from the outside.
- The hub is a great resource, but not for adults - it's geared toward kids and teens which is needed - we mustn't steamroll that either.
- Re-instate a SEND youth group at The Hub. There used to be one then it was shut down.

FTC Green Spaces/Play Areas

- The park at the rec needs work. It's the biggest and most used in the areas and really needs refurbishment and to be expanded. Take down the old seat/ climbing frame outside of the park boundary. It's barely used and quite unsafe. You can then extend the park and have more options for children similar to Amptill park.
- Flower beds look nice, grass in FTC areas need cutting more frequently.
- The green space normally looks good but this year no plants have been planted!
- There has been improvement in children's facilities. However, the areas where adults can walk safely, for their physical and mental wellbeing, are being reduced.
- We love a walk round the Manor Park. We don't know anything about the mentioned Nature Park.
- The play park at Tesco could do with some updates - a trampoline in the ground perhaps? The village hall would also benefit from an overhaul - it's looking tired.
- Parks haven't been improved in years look tired and worn always grubby
- The playgrounds could do with an upgrade.
- More resources for "other" green spaces. There needs more care for those spaces to look better. Benches around these "other" green spaces would promote community feeling and more bins away from the centre MAY help the littering problem.
- The play parks could be updated and improved upon, especially the play park on Hatfield Road. Picnic tables for young families to meet up and eat outdoors, especially in Millennium Park and other play parks. Green spaces need to be maintained regularly.
- During the winter months, it is obvious green areas are not well looked after and a lot of areas are being damaged by cars being parked on these green spaces. If they are not to

be maintained, then a discussion should be had to remove these areas and create parking spaces to stop drivers parking where they shouldn't. I would prefer the roads and parking be expanded rather than have cars parked on top of green grass areas causing damage and muddy cesspools.

- Play parks in Trafalgar and Naseby are 25+ years old. They are getting rusty and need updating. More up to date equipment.
- Playparks have not been maintained well.
- Play park on the Millenium Park is small and could do with equipment for older children.
- Litter, roads, grass and tree maintenance all Need improvement
- The volunteer group in Manor Park is a good start.
- Parks are good but need more things in them/ updates. And when things break they take forever to be replaced. Splash park at the rec is needed, would be so good.
- More and better use of green spaces for biodiversity.
- Great Manor Park and walks.
- The parks are working well.
- Green areas and kids play areas,
- Public spaces owned by FTC are not particularly well maintained, litter is a problem in millennium Park and Manor Park is becoming worse. Never see the grounds team that active during the day. Dog bins are never emptied and since FTC stopped doing dog poo bags, dog fouling has certainly got a lot worse over the years.
- I know not all green spaces are managed by the town council but can the town council work with CBC to get these cuts more regularly so they can be used as play areas for children.
- The Rufus Centre always looks tidy.
- Turn Manor Park into a true park with a small coffee shop, the walks are beautiful and it would be more attractive if there was a seating area like Ampthill Park.
- Could some "chicken wire" for example be put on the bottom of the fencing by the skate park to prevent it blowing towards the school/Temple Way?
- Flowers on the roundabout always look pretty.
- The gates at Flitwick wood, the rec etc are not wide enough to get a buggy or wheelchair through.
- Use permanent plants than one you throw away each year!
- It would be helpful to have more litter picking, and provide more benches and bins in certain areas - particularly station road park and Hinksley field playing grounds. The nature area looks abandoned and efforts need to go to the area to improve biodiversity and amenities to make it attractive to both people and wildlife.
- More attention to biodiversity.
- Flitwick needs to protect it's green spaces from CBC's ambitions to build on every patch of land. People need access to green spaces for quality of life
- More protection of our parks, more wild flowers.
- Actually, ask the disabled community before you act. Like the stupid idea of putting a radar lock on the manor park disabled parking. I can't go anymore because of this, it takes too much energy to get in and out of the car to unlock the gate. Noone was

consulted before the money was p*** away on something that decreases disabled access.

- Stop wasting money on vanity projects like the electric gates to Manor Park which cost thousands and are never ever used.
- More flowers/ trees where possible.
- Use of grass verges for wildflowers, specific wildlife habitats in parks and green spaces.
- More benches.
- No facilities are provided by the council to the west part of the town no seating provided on the mount for instance.
- More planting around town.
- More benches around the town.
- Increase wildflower areas.
- Invest in an Aeroleaf tree in town to not only generate electricity but also create a focal point.
- Benches, bins – wildflowers.
- Wasn't the 'nature park' originally meant to have a visitor centre and parking?
- The lake needs to be dredged, and the sluice opened to allow water to go into the lake. The red stream is very DANGEROUS if any one step into it is like quicksand and needs to be dredged.

Litter and Cleanliness

- Litter picks and youth activities needed
- Happy with regular booklets and events/clubs happening in area. Should be more presence in schools to increase awareness; more litter picking/community events/ joint school events/ children learning about resources, opportunities to learn or share time with older people, charities in the area, communal walks etc.
- More recycling bins.
- Sort the litter out / get a litter collector like Amptill has and more bins The town is disgusting
- There used to be regular litter picking groups around town. Another "saving" which leaves the whole town a scruffy, untidy mess. Hedges verges as well as litter , never mind the abandoned dog poo bags everywhere. I don't feel part of any community anymore!
- It would be helpful to have more litter picking and provide more benches and bins in certain areas - particularly station road park and Hinksley field playing grounds. The nature area looks abandoned, and efforts need to go to the area to improve biodiversity and amenities to make it attractive to both people and wildlife.
- Beside the school alleyway off Bluebell Close, there is a general waste bin that dog walkers use a lot for dog waste, it would be good to have a dog bin in the area with a lid.
- Making it easier to recycle and bin stuff Build more community pride.
- If you take action regarding the litter, it would make a difference I don't think anyone can be proud of the town when it so scruffy.
- I would like to see Flitwick a litter free and safe place, but it is not.

- Need a lot more dog waste bins. I have never seen a litter/street cleaner in Flitwick but have regularly seen one in Ampthill.
- Littering in the Town and along many roads.
- I think the town needs tidying up the railings which are broken at the top of the avenue need to be re done the old bank is a big mistake it's far to big for a single restaurant to be able to be successfully running in it we do not have the footfall it needs to be portioned into smaller units either for a food court type of thing or for smaller units so they can have start up units kind of like a mini shopping area the flowers in the tubs outside never look full enough I have been to other towns where they have the same tubs and flowers are overflowing all year round we gave no pride in the appearance of the town if I were visiting the town I would drive through thinking what a bland tatty place with no centre or heart . There are too many houses being built with no extra facilities like dr, schools shops etc basically there is nothing here that would make people want to come except for the train line. With the new theme park coming now is the time to step up and make Flitwick a place that guests will want to stay, shop visit make us proud of where we live and sort out the old bank as you all said you would.
- Lots of rubbish lying around, maybe engage local schools in clearing it up, as majority of the littering is done by kids.
- Litter and pop bins are overflowing; litter is strewn all over the town. The town looks and feels tatty.
- The booking system at the tidy tip and charging for green bin collection has caused a lot of fly tipping in the lanes and countryside near where I live - lots of garden rubbish/ grass cuttings etc and various other types of rubbish in the bushes and fields.
- We need our own street cleaner in town.
- I am in favour of CCTV to cover areas where there has been vandalism and/or deliberate depositing litter. I approve of fines and penalties given for fly tipping and dog fouling and any of the above. There are litter wardens in Wales, known as environmental enforcement officers. They are employed by local councils to issue fixed penalty notices (FPNs) for littering and dog fouling. Fines are around £75.
- If you take action regarding the litter, it would make a difference I don't think anyone can be proud of the town when it so scruffy.
- I would like to see Flitwick a litter free and safe place, but it is not.
- Do we have an employed litter picker? There is more litter in Flitwick than there used to be.
- Rubbish absolutely everywhere on any patch of grass available, more bins needed, especially around Hinksley field. Appreciate one was added by the skate park and people are too lazy to use it and still dump litter on the floor next to the bin. Bin needed outside vape shop as there is constantly vape packaging and pods all over the place at the top of the avenue.
- I'm not sure if Flitwick Council could help with the lack of dry recycling bin collections - we have missed two recently due to fires and contractor problems.
- Making it easier to recycle and bin stuff Build more community pride.
- We need better access to recycling banks. Perhaps create a space (with cameras) specifically for textile, soft plastic and glass bins for the community.
- Swap shop of recycled goods.
- It would be helpful to have more litter picking and provide more benches and bins in certain areas - particularly station road park and Hinksley field playing grounds. The nature area looks abandoned, and efforts need to go to the area to improve biodiversity and amenities to make it attractive to both people and wildlife.
- Dog waste bins are excellent. Refuse collection is going down hill.

- Rubbish and litter on pavements and other public areas is becoming worse and is very under resourced in comparison with Ampthill who have a regular street cleaner.

Roads, Parking and Pathways

- Most curbs need lowering for wheelchair users
- The roads are not built to take the amount of traffic it has. A bypass needs to be provided, especially as and when the Disney site gets built.
- Remove A boards from pavements.
- Pothole improvements! A pelican crossing by the Blackbirds pub would also be good.
- Stop the parking on areas where it is not permitted. People are too lazy to walk anywhere. It is very dangerous. Inclusive - recognise all members of society.
- The gates at Flitwick wood, the rec etc are not wide enough to get a buggy or wheelchair through
- Pathways across Flitwick seriously need to be checked, far too many are very uneven or overgrown, almost all the pavements have been dug up and look terrible plus they are uneven.
- More focus on better pavements for all, road repairs, street lighting and ensuring the town is litter free and safe.
- Trim all the bushes that have overgrown the pathways, clear the drains as all full of mud etc.
- Stop all the building and endless digging up of roads
- More blue badge parking. Stopping bad parking to enable people to navigate pavements safely.
- By sorting out the traffic situation. We need less traffic going through and the traffic that does needs to be going more slowly so residents aren't endangered.
- A real roundabout at crossroads to high street.
- Accessibility around the bridge it's a nightmare with a pram crossing all the roads.
- Better pavements with access for wheelchairs as at the moment some pavements have high kerbs that you can't get up.
- Take a more aggressive stance on road traffic congestion and planning issues ahead of time, i.e. via the local plan and full involvement in it. Rubbish and litter on pavements and other public areas is becoming worse and is very under resourced in comparison with Ampthill who have a regular street cleaner.
- Some roads are in a terrible condition.
- Sort out crossing the road over the railway bridge and near Tesco. It's dangerous and impossible for older people.
- Better pavements and lighting along Dunstable Road - a main thoroughfare into the town, is required.
- Pavements are much in need of renovation.
- The traffic in Flitwick needs to be less and road repairs need to be improved.
- The Avenue needs white lines down the middle of the road, it is a accident waiting to happen, lost count of the number of times forced onto the pavement with oncoming traffic that DO NOT HAVE RIGHT OF WAY.
- Improvements of pavements, the rough, uneven surface of the pavements are a hazard for people with mobility issues and baby buggies. This is often compounded by cars being parked on the pavements. Improvements in these two areas would greatly improve resident satisfaction and safety.
- It is not accessible for the blind or for wheelchair users.

- Streets are narrow, have a limited capacity and can't handle more traffic and cars. Yet you are allowing more houses to be built within the town.
- Stop housing development in Flitwick. It's increasing traffic.
- There are also lots of potholes in and around Flitwick. There is also a lack of parking available - Tesco is the hub, but it's difficult to get parked near Costa/the doctors - Highlands - near this area.
- As a disabled resident, the path ways are dangerous, lack of disability access to all parks and green spaces, lack of disabled parking in the town.
- Enforce parking regulating it a safer environment for everyone.
- Clutter free pavements. Outside costa there are often bins and A boards along that stretch.
- Have cycle and scooter lanes.
- Roads need repairing and stop building new housing, leave that to bigger councils. We don't have the infrastructure.
- It is essential to improve the quality of our pavements to ensure they are level and free from patches and uneven surfaces, This is vital for the safety and independence of elderly residents and those using mobility scooters, who require smooth, unobstructed path to travel safety.
- Need to have a crossing on the railway bridge. It is a nightmare when trains come in and people are running across and not looking properly - so many near misses.
- There is too much leniency given to those that double park around the bus stop area alongside Tesco which has the potential to cause an accident when lorries arrive and leave the warehouse. There is adequate parking in the Tesco carpark so no excuse for parking on double yellow lines. Dog fouling seems to have increased over the last few weeks, maybe some reminders on social media and fines that can be issued would help.
- People can all residents be asked to cut hedges/trees back that cover the pavement as a person who has difficulty walking it is a real problem.
- Parking - commuters are starting to park in residential streets. Also, parking on pavements! Some dog owners do not pick up dog litter. Traffic speeds through Temple Way and Manor Way.
- Road infrastructure needs improving particularly with all of the new houses and those are now going to be on Steppingley Road opposite the new care home. Parking needs improving. Better road surfaces, Steppingley Road is getting worse and worse. More houses requires more Doctors places.
- Wish people would pick up their dog poo. Not only at the parks, but also the streets. Not FTC fault but the only issue I come across.
- Please ticket cars that park on paths or inconsiderately/dangerously. Encourage residents to take pride in where they live, education regarding litter issues.
- Volume of traffic is increasing all the time, with the new housing development on Steppingley Rd and the Universal Theme Park there will be major issues on speeding traffic and more people cutting through Flitwick. Steppingley Road needs traffic calming measures and more needs to be done to stop traffic cutting through past the school and the roundabouts by Tesco's as they are regularly gridlocked and this will only get worse.
- Dog fouling on the walk to school, and even right outside the school (Templefield) is a big problem.
- Parking on the paths is a big problem in Flitwick yet nothing is done about it.
- The amount of dog poo not being picked up by owners is herendous! Walking to school with my 6 year old and a buggy, you have to keep your eyes peeled and dodge the poo.

- Public bins not emptied often enough. speeding on Steppingley Road every day, parking during the school run on Beaumont Road is dangerous every day, Dog mess not being picked up with zero consequences.
- We've now had recycling suspended twice. This is a service we pay for and not received Parking by the old bank is an issue.
- Roads full of potholes, and we need more speeding restrictions.
- Station Road, by the Crown Pub, is awful for people parking in dangerous ways.
- Trying to get parking enforcement in Flitwick around schools at drop off/collection times. Maybe seeing if opposite Flitwick lower it's possible to add a parking bay so people don't park on the grass when going to the school or the skate park.
- We desperately need more bins in Brooks Road, Hinksley Road and Park, St Peters Close, St Mark's close, Roman Road, Ivel Road, Hatfield Road, Highlands, High Street. *Regular street cleaners around the town. *Stricter fines for dog fouling and poo bags discarded on footpaths and open spaces. *Stricter fines for double parking and blocking footpaths. *Regular patrols in the east Flitwick as it's become a free for all drugs dealing, electric scooters, speeding, drinking in public. *stricter fines on unkempt boundaries and hedges. *stricter fines for vehicles parking on grass spaces and destroying the side verge. Bring back the local Bobby who would walk around the town and keep the town in order.. More police presence.
- People can't park properly. They park on double yellows or the pavement it in front of my driveway preventing me from getting out.
- Parking is needed for high street/ station square, not chargeable and not on double yellows, people tend to be in and out quickly but park in obscure places blocking traffic as they have no where to go without risk of ticket.
- Definitely need more traffic warden patrols and litter picking.
- People are still letting there dog poo everywhere and not picking it up so you have to be so careful where you walk.
- Stopping free road access to Moors. Speeding not a problem in Flitwick as cannot drive as too many cars on the roads or parking on the roads.
- Street cleaning is definitely poor compared to previously. Main roads etc. seem ok, but alleyways such as the one between Tesco and Kendal Drive are often dirtier than they used to be.
- Whilst there's at least 1 car I can intermittently hear racing around Flitwick area once every week or 2, it isn't as big a problem as some areas. Same with dog fouling and poor parking, it's far less than some areas I've previously lived in.
- Potholes and road surfaces are terrible at the moment. Disappointed that more green space is being ruined with housing. The roads are already so congested. There is not enough resources for locals. Post office, bank, more access to doctors. With a load of new houses being built, the infrastructure of Flitwick is going to take a huge hit, and I don't think it can handle it.
- The state of paths and roads is disgusting. The more houses that are build the more heavy vehicles we have coming through the area churning up the roads. Potholes are a major issue. Paths are so dangerous for anyone, trip hazards and raised man covers. Try supporting all roads including Vicarage Hill and Hornes End leading to Fir Tree. Not just the expensive houses roads. Then try implementing parking fines to pay for this with regards to pavement parking everywhere and Van's continuously parking on vicarage hill and hanging over the spaces making it difficult to see round. There even seems to be a regular coach parked there now on the path...its ridiculous.
- As a pedestrian. There are no road safety measures in Flitwick. Walking children to school along any of the main roads is so dangerous. My children and I have almost been hit

crossing from the bridge via the central island across to the Jewellers about 3 or 4 times in the last 6 months. The speed at which large commercial trucks and vehicles go down Dunstable road is appalling. All the surrounding towns and villages have some sort of traffic calming, such as 20 mph, speed cameras, or regular speed humps - whereas Flitwick has none on the main roads. It needs sorting before a pedestrian gets killed. The amount of dog muck on the streets, particularly on the pavements that lead to the schools is awful.

- The pavements throughout the Town are in a bad state, they are uneven where repairs to utilities have taken place and not reinstated properly. They are also restricted in width due to vegetation, trees and shrubs reducing the available width. Although this gets reported on 'FixMyStreet' nothing ever gets done and year on year the problem gets even worse, especially awkward for those with vision problems and parents pushing buggies/prams.
- Parking . I live in Chapel Road and have long since stopped driving out of the bottom onto Windmill Road as it is just too risky. Despite there being double yellow lines at the corners, people persist in parking on them for that 'quick dash - I'll only be a minute ' into the corner shop, forcing traffic leaving Chapel Road to venture unsighted into the middle of Windmill Road. This will not stop until drivers are fined, named and shamed.
- Appears to be an increase in amount of dog poos not being picked up. Overall town is clean and tidy. Dropping of litter near skate park is an issue.
- There is a need to review road safety say twice a year and include this in surveys as well as access issues for disabled people. Are all speed detectors working? Why not move the one near the raised road surface on Steppingley Road at end of Manor Way to nearer the schools. More dropped kerbs are required in Flitwick. Some were marked up on Manor Way in yellow but never implemented. Why not lay a footpath on Church Road/Temple Way from end of Manor Way to opposite entrance bollards to Church Road, where residents have to walk on a muddy path in grass. Potholes and road markings need more regular attention. Consider a pedestrian crossing on railway bridge. In Manor Way parking is allowed too near last road safety restriction prior to Byron Crescent so sight of traffic overtaking park cars is too restricted. etc. etc.
- Dog fouling on our front lawn couple times. Dog waste is put in the open bin a lot, and we need a dog bin beside the alleyway with a lid.
- Dog fouling around the town and dogs running loose.
- Dog fouling seems a problem in certain areas. There are warnings about fines, but I have never heard of anyone being fined. Does this happen? Are areas patrolled?
- People allow their dogs to foul on a small plot of land next to my house, the council don't even maintain that grassed area...grass cutting, litter build up... Kids hand out around Millennium park to quite later and the litter they leave around the park and bus stop is atrocious. My car has been keyed 2 times when parked overnight.... Damage to bus stop canopy where the glass is smashed... I can't comment fully on the drugs and drunkenness as I'm rarely out at night to experience it... No mention of homelessness on the list?
- The state of the pavements are in great need of improvement. Pushing my wife in her wheelchair has become harder.
- You should provide more dog waste bins along the bridal way by Steppingley Road field and the paths by Flitwick wood, there's dozens full bags of dog waste chucked everywhere which is simply disgusting!!!!
- There is always dog mess down the path between Templefield and Woodlands.
- I pray that someone reads this and truly actually takes a moment to think about it: Why is there a maximum £1000 fine for dog *** in the street but NOTHING for the enormous horse s*** that is left in the middle of paths and roads, only to reek, splatter everywhere

once it gets inevitably run over and have the smell reactivate after it next rains? I live in Townfield road. This is all the time. WHY are there no regulations on the copious quantities of horse shit that appear up and down the road? I'm not joking, there is at least one pile on the go at all times - especially during the warmer parts of the year. Please do something about this, it's vile. What's worse is when the oldies shovel it off the streets and put it their gardens which SPREADS THE SMELL EVEN FURTHER! 2. The mowers have been out today and if you look down the main road from the village hall down to temple way, the amount of litter shredded and left out in the grass is obscene. Go and look - I bet it's still there. It's been there for months. The worst I see is the grass verge next to the traffic lights on the edge of the Russell centre. It's always there for whatever reason.

- Public footpaths around the town are getting overgrown with hedges from people's gardens and restrictions for prams and mobility scooters.
- Parking a big problem where we are with station commuters increasing because of local villages getting larger, there needs to be a resident led digital permit app or something that doesn't cost but can increase town council income. We also could do with double yellows as the school traffic with commuters can clog Bluebell Close.
- Poor parking lots of cars parked every day fully on the pavement really annoying.
- Definitely need more parking without having to pay a fortune.
- Parking in the Birds Estate and by Flitwick Lower School is unsafe, with cars fully parking across pavements and virtually bumper to bumper.
- More speed cameras, more slow speeds, more lighting.
- I live in Station Road, and at night cars are speeding up the street.
- Fed up with people using the pavements to park and parking right on junctions and double parking leaving no room for emergency vehicles to get through if needed.
- Sort out the commuter parking, prioritise people who live in Flitwick, issue parking permits so that residents can park out their house on the street. Commuters sometimes park their vehicles from 6/7am and don't return until gone 10pm in some instances...
- Speeding and poor parking on The Avenue in Flitwick is increasing. Parking next to the vape shop on double yellow lines is increasing and causing significant risk to drivers and pedestrians, especially as often the footpath is fully blocked forcing pedestrians into the road.
- Traffic on Steppingley Road is horrendous, how will it cope when the new houses are built?
- Parking on the paddocks. There is a constant row of cars parking at the entrance to the paddocks every day. I suspect workers from Aldi, who can't park at their own workplace for too long else they get fined. On a day with football on the whole area is unsafe and I dread needing an ambulance or fire engine, as people will die.
- Speed is very much an issue again throughout Flitwick but especially the main roads in and out (Dunstable, kings road) many times people do not even stop at red lights at crossings.
- Millwright Way / Windmill Road is the worst area of Flitwick for driving through due to the amount of vehicles parked. If you are using the corner shop to post items often there is nowhere to wait in a vehicle. Millwright way is a nightmare. In addition, the Tesco roundabout is bad at the best of times and is due to get worse with the amount of development happening. I am worried we will lose more of our green space to development.
- Speeding traffic.
- Builders parking and driving on the Bridle Path.

- The number of traffic lights that's ALWAYS about is so disruptive. We moved here 4 years ago and we've never had ANY time where there's been no building or no traffic lights for an extensive amount of time.
- Speeding on Maulden Road – and you wonder why so many houses are sold and up for sale. Speed cameras need to be put on this road.
- Ampthill Road could do with better traffic calming measures during rush hour etc. both of the electric speed limit signs haven't worked in years and if there is traffic on the motor way lorries can come at excess of 40mph down that bit of road.
- The traffic going forward is a big worry as the centre as it is will not cope. We live on a cut through Ampthill and the speeding is frightening as we have a park for children close by.
- Parking on pavements.
- It's no good doing the occasional traffic warden in the day, they need to come in the evening when everyone is back from work or on Friday night at Vicarage Hill shops. It's a great way of getting extra money and solve the parking chaos at the same time before someone gets hurt.
- Far too many temporary traffic lights and road works. Absolutely ridiculous that the latest set of traffic lights on Steppingley Road is just so 4 cars can park along there. We don't want any more houses!!!
- We can hear cars speeding down Steppingley road (when there aren't traffic lights!!). Poor parking by contractors and also by parents at school times.
- Please can the Council look at speed calming measures along Steppingley Road. It is a very busy road and everyone picks up speed quickly especially going down hill. The above road will become even busier when the new houses will be sold and inhabited. What are the future plans to ensure road safety along a road where many people walk so close to the traffic? The surface of Steppingley road is in a terrible condition with many potholes and dips which has causes drivers to swerve and drive dangerously.
- The parking outside the vape shop on the avenue needs to be addressed. Grass cutting around Flitwick is hit and miss. The traffic lights in Steppingley road is causing uproar but when a resident parked on opposite side of road nothing was done.
- During the day, roads are extremely busy and cars often speed. Roads are unsafe themselves with markings not clear, potholes, junctions with inappropriate traffic lights, crossings or humps.
- Too much traffic speeding can't walk on most paths as cars park on them.
- Vehicles parked on the verge at the skate park even when parking area is clear create a hazardous situation particularly when young drivers don't worry about checking all is clear before reversing off.
- On the roads, dangerous speeding cars all of the time. Potholes and uneven surfaces.
- Traffic on Steppingley. Coming from motorway Roundabout at Tesco in morning and at 5 pm a bloody nightmare.
- . Cars/motor bikes driving at ridiculous speeds along Station Road/Kings Road. Unable to cross safely across the train bridge cars come around the corners too quick.
- Major lack of parking enforcement.
- The amount of pavement parking is an area of great concern personally. I have often had to walk into the road when either my grandchildren because cars are blocking access to the pavement! This is making me feel very unsafe walking both during the day and evening especially given the speed some people drive ! The Birds estate is particularly bad for this.
- Driving standards are appalling and dangerous for pedestrians. Selfish drivers park anywhere they like and there are never any traffic wardens.

- Walking along Steppingley Road due to poor width of pavements, the volume of traffic and likely increase in traffic on the road means more vehicles driving, making the pavement width a major concern. Also, the lack of connected pathways between the Steppingley Gardens and the Leisure Centre, around the back of the Leisure Centre the pathways are not completed to connect to the estate, which means my children have to walk along the unsafe narrower pavement at Steppingley Road.
- Dog fouling on our front lawn couple times. Dog waste is put in the open bin a lot, and we need a dog bin beside the alleyway with a lid.
- Dog fouling around the town and dogs running loose.
- Dog fouling seems a problem in certain areas. There are warnings about fines, but I have never heard of anyone being fined. Does this happen? Are areas patrolled?
- People allow their dogs to foul on a small plot of land next to my house, the council don't even maintain that grassed area...grass cutting, litter build up... Kids hand out around Millennium Park to quite later and the litter they leave around the park and bus stop is atrocious.
- The state of the pavements are in great need of improvement. Pushing my wife in her wheelchair has become harder.
- You should provide more dog waste bins along the bridal way by Steppingley Road field and the paths by Flitwick wood, there's dozens full bags of dog waste chucked everywhere which is simply disgusting!!!!
- There is always dog mess down the path between Templefield and Woodlands.
- I pray that someone reads this and truly actually takes a moment to think about it: Why is there a maximum £1000 fine for dog *** in the street but NOTHING for the enormous horse s*** that is left in the middle of paths and roads, only to reek, splatter everywhere once it gets inevitably run over and have the smell reactivate after it next rains? I live in Townfield road. This is all the time. WHY are there no regulations on the copious quantities of horse **** that appear up and down the road? I'm not joking, there is at least one pile on the go at all times - especially during the warmer parts of the year. Please do something about this, it's vile. What's worse is when the oldies shovel it off the streets and put it their gardens which SPREADS THE SMELL EVEN FURTHER! 2. The mowers have been out today and if you look down the main road from the village hall down to temple way, the amount of litter shredded and left out in the grass is obscene. Go and look - I bet it's still there. It's been there for months. The worst I see is the grass verge next to the traffic lights on the edge of the Russell centre. It's always there for whatever reason.
- Public footpaths around the town are getting overgrown with hedges from people's gardens and restrictions for prams and mobility scooters.
- Improvements of pavements, the rough, uneven surface of the pavements are a hazard for people with mobility issues and baby buggies. This is often compounded by cars being parked on the pavements. Improvements in these two areas would greatly improve resident satisfaction and safety.
- The common green spaces are not maintained regularly. Potholes are not filled.
- Better pavement repairs
- More doggy poo bins!
- Stop cars parking around Manor way, makes it very dangerous for kids crossing to get to school.
- There are also lots of potholes in and around Flitwick.
- More flowers/ trees where possible. More parking restrictions so encourage walking. Better traffic calming measure for the main roads.

- Use of grass verges for wildflowers, specific wildlife habitats in parks and green spaces, encouraging residents to embrace renewable energy and EVs.
- Wider footpaths for mobility scooters.
- Engaging with CBC to ensure trees/hedges do not encroach on paths and footpaths do not become overgrown.
- It is essential to improve the quality of our pavements to ensure they are level and free from patches and uneven surfaces, This is vital for the safety and independence of elderly residents and those using mobility scooters, who require smooth, unobstructed path to travel safety. To enhance the town's visual appeal, I suggest transforming the verges and open green spaces bordering our streets with landscaped flower beds and ornamental small street trees.
- Need to have a crossing on the railway bridge. It is a nightmare when trains come in and people are running across and not looking properly – so many near misses.
- Enforce parking regulating it a safer environment for everyone.
- We need a central hub and better parking. Barclays would be ideal but parking is terrible. We desperately need a post office or banking hub please.
- Clutter free pavements. Outside Costa there are often bins and A boards along that stretch.
- Very small road already overloaded with traffic with no real plan to manage this surge in housing at Steppingley Fields.
- A real roundabout at crossroads to High Street, hanging plants from the lamppost and garden roof on bus stops. electric scooter/ bike scheme with Ampthill and surrounding parishes as lots of people commute using the train station which makes car parking ridiculous and you know this will get worse by the time Universal Studios opens unless you do a multi storey car park which are all very unsightly so a scheme like that which already operates in MK/ London etc. would be fab.
- Accessibility around the bridge it's a nightmare with a pram crossing all the roads.
- Take a more aggressive stance on road traffic congestion and planning issues ahead of time, i.e. via the local plan and full involvement in it.
- Some roads are in a terrible condition
- Sort out crossing the road over the railway bridge and near Tesco. It's dangerous and impossible for older people.
- Better pavements and lighting along Dunstable Road - a main thoroughfare into the town, is required.
- Pavements are much in need of renovation
- The traffic in Flitwick needs to be less and road repairs need to be improved.
- the avenue needs white lines down the middle of the road, it is a accident waiting to happen, lost count of the number of times forced onto the pavement with oncoming traffic that DO NOT HAVE RIGHT OF WAY.
- Ultimately - reducing the amount and the speed of traffic going along the main roads should be the priority. It's like walking past a death track on the school run every day. Needs sorting ASAP.
- Lovely to see a new pedestrian gate opposite Flitwick Lower School at last. Nearly 2 decades of asking.
- Clean up our environment. Rubbish everywhere. Dog poo everywhere. More police presence. More support from council services such as an effective dog warden. Effectively maintain grass verges. Car parking wardens and effective management of illegal, dangerous, inconsiderate parking.

- Biggest improvement needed is tidying up on main roads behind residents houses it all looks shocking. Verges all look shocking even after they've been cut. Trees in church yard all need desperately cutting back.. Church Road needs hedges all cut back drastically so you can actually see the side of the road. Bins at the church yard need emptying way more often. All these things like verges when you enter Flitwick from whatever road does not look appealing at all it looks scruffy and totally uncared for. I'm sure the maintenance team the council employ to do the roundabout and the odd verge cutting could do these small jobs which would make such a difference to the approach to Flitwick. Flitwick needs desperate help on all the above.
- Double yellow lines are needed in a lot of places.

COMMUNITY FRIDGE

- The community fridge and the development of the old Barclays building are to be commended.
- Improve the community fridge and management of the fridge.
- The community fridge used to be excellent but now is very biased to people on benefits. People who do not qualify for any government benefits does not mean that they are well off and the free food used to be so helpful. The people running it say £1 a visit isn't much to pay but it is when you are on a tight budget. I never use it anymore for that reason and I don't think that the council understand that fact.
- The community fridge is now not as community thought of- I used to use it but then I had to start writing my name, then the hours where unhelpful with a young family and now you need to apply to be part of it so it has completely put me off and I now drive to Clophill to their community food bank.
- There is a large amount of emphasis on the Community Fridge - is this too much?
- The council appears to spend a great deal of time supporting items such as Share Flitwick, the community fridge - perhaps it needs to realise the majority of residents do not care about this.
- Less resource and attention to community fridge as it seems to be the only community factor FTC are concerned with and throw most resource into.
- Love the community fridge and share!
- I think the fridge is great, but it has changed, sometimes people are not very friendly. I don't feel that it is for everybody in Flitwick. My friend comes from out of town which is a good support for her, but I feel that the council should focus on supporting its own residents first.
- The fridge has changed and I am not sure it is as good as it was.
- Move the fridge so that it is more central, not just available for people in their cars.
- Town council seems more concerned with community fridge than the safety of residents.

BURIAL GROUND

- The new crematorium is a good addition, but where, in Flitwick, can Flitwick residents bury their family members who have been residents all of their lives?? This needs to be addressed.
- The cemetery is full so when are the council getting more land for us residents that have lived in Flitwick many years get buried near family and friends.
- My main concern is BURIAL GROUND!!! What is being done to provide a new burial ground as this seems to be being completely overlooked!! The present one is full!!! We have loved ones that we would like to be near when our time comes!! Obviously, that can't happen on the same ground BUT we live in Flitwick and want to be buried in Flitwick...not sent to a neighbouring town !! Surely this should be a priority of our town council !! As apparently it isn't mid beds !!
- The cemetery is FULL! Not all residents want to be cremated and should have the option to be buried in the town they have lived in some all their lives. To have this option removed from them is unacceptable and inhumane. Forcing residents to bury their loved ones in towns outside the parish they have lived and paid into is just unfair. This issue for too long has been put aside for too long. I have raised my concerns years ago and all I get is - water table too high / land too expensive! Shame on FTC for not having sorted out alternatives years ago. Do FTC compensate residents who have to pay extra to bury their loved ones outside of the town they have lived and contributed towards? A history of a town can be seen walking through a cemetery; local family names repeat themselves the ages of the people and once lived before all the new estates every one complains about. Not all the residents of these "over 55" developments will want to be cremated!!
- Flitwick Cemetery. Where can the people of Flitwick be laid to rest now the cemetery is full? This is an urgent issue and shouldn't be shrugged off with cremation option or being buried out of catchment.
- A new burial site needs to be found !!!!
- There's a lot of "that wouldn't happen in Ampthill", we can't even be buried in our own town,

Residents, community groups, councillors, voluntary sector organisations and local businesses all play a part in shaping our experience of Flitwick. This document outlines how Flitwick Town council aims to engage with our communities, and how we embed a person-centred and bottom-up approach to service delivery across Flitwick.

Community engagement is an overarching term that describes ways we can build and sustain relationships between the Council and our local community. This will be a catalyst to facilitate open dialogue, helping both Flitwick Town Council and residents to understand issues within and the actions needed to improve the experience of everyone in Flitwick.

The three essential principles to drive successful teamwork and organisational change by fostering transparent information flow, collective problem-solving, and shared dedication to goals. Effective communication ensures understanding, whilst collaboration leverages diverse strengths for collective success. Commitment for all parties to maintain momentum and achieve effective outcomes.

PURPOSE

Flitwick Town Council has a duty to consult communities on key decisions and to ensure **fairness, openness and accountability in decision making**.

COMMUNITY PROFILE

Flitwick is a growing market town with a diverse and active community. It benefits from good transport links, attractive parks and nature reserves, a leisure centre, community hubs, and a strong network of local clubs, volunteers, and businesses.

Demographic Information (2025 Estimates)

- Population: Approximately 13,800 residents in Flitwick parish.
- Age Structure: A balanced mix across under-18s, working-age adults, and older residents.
- Ethnicity: Predominantly White British, with small Asian, Black, Mixed, Arab, and other minority groups.
- Households: Around 5,800 households.
- Key Features: Flitwick Manor and Manor Park, Flitwick Moor, Flitwick Wood, The Rufus Centre, The Hub, Flitwick Leisure Centre.

Flagship initiatives such as the Flitwick Community Fridge (reducing food waste and supporting families) demonstrate the Flitwick Town Council's commitment to community-led solutions.

Flitwick is home to a broad range of communities. This strategy recognises their diverse needs and contributions.

OUR UNDERSTANDING OF COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Community engagement builds and sustains trusted relationships between the Council and local people. It means:

- Open, two-way communication.
- Involving residents in shaping decisions, not just consulting after decisions are made.
- Tailoring engagement to people, place and policy.
- Maximising social value by ensuring activities deliver wider benefits — for example, reducing waste, building skills, strengthening social networks and improving health.

We commit to key principles:

- Inclusion – overcome barriers to participation.
- Planning – clear purpose for engagement.
- Working together – effective collaboration.
- Methods – fit-for-purpose techniques.
- Communication – clear, regular, accessible.

- Impact & Social Value – measure how engagement improves wellbeing, sustainability, and local prosperity.

We will proactively reach out to groups who may experience barriers to participation — including disabled residents, people with SEND, older adults, minority ethnic groups and carers — to ensure their voices are heard and valued.

STRATEGIC THEMES

Here are the 5 themes that will underpin the strategy and be threaded through Flitwick Town Council's development plans and engagement methods.

1. Community Engagement & Inclusion

This theme focuses on ensuring everyone can access, participate in and influence Council engagement opportunities, regardless of background, ability or circumstance. We will use co-design and coproduction approaches to ensure residents, especially those whose voices are less often heard, help shape services and community initiatives.

- Provide regular opportunities for all residents, including disabled people, residents with SEND, older adults, and minority ethnic groups, to share views with the Council.
- Make engagement activities accessible and welcoming to all groups.
- Ensure that engagement contributes to social value by building skills, confidence, and connections.

What we have done:

One successful community engagement initiative has been the Annual Residents' Survey, which gathers feedback on Council services, priorities and what residents would like to see included in the Council programme. This survey enables a wide range of residents to share their views and helps the Council collaborate with the community when shaping future delivery.

What we will do:

The next Annual Survey will be issued in March 2026. In addition, we will hold community drop-in sessions in different parts of the town and use group feedback forms and targeted engagement activities to help shape service delivery and ensure more residents can influence decisions.

2. Health, Wellbeing & Leisure

This theme promotes physical, mental and social wellbeing by increasing access to health services, leisure opportunities and support initiatives across the town.

- Promote healthy, active lifestyles and wellbeing for all residents.
- Work with local partners to increase access to health and leisure opportunities.
- Use community projects like the Flitwick Community Fridge to tackle food waste and support vulnerable residents.

- **What we have done:**

The Council has supported initiatives such as the Flitwick Community Fridge, which helps reduce food waste, supports families, and provides volunteering opportunities that help reduce social isolation and improve wellbeing.

- **What we will do:**

We will continue working with local partners to promote health and wellbeing **events**, increase awareness of local leisure opportunities, and support community-based initiatives that encourage active and healthy lifestyles.

3. Events, Culture & Heritage

This theme celebrates Flitwick's identity by promoting cultural expression, community events and heritage awareness.

- Celebrate Flitwick's identity, culture and history.
- Increase opportunities for residents to take part in community events.

- **What we have done:**

The Council has supported and promoted community events and activities that bring residents together and celebrate Flitwick's identity, helping to strengthen community connection and local pride.

- **What we will do:**

We will continue to work with local groups and organisations to develop inclusive community events and cultural activities, ensuring opportunities are accessible and reflective of the town's diverse community.

4 Environment & Sustainability

This theme supports environmental responsibility and sustainable practise through community led action and Council leadership.

- Support community-led environmental projects.
- Reduce waste and promote sustainable practices at Council events and facilities.

- **What we have done:**

The Council has supported **community-led environmental activities**, including local clean-up efforts and initiatives that promote pride in the local environment.

- **What we will do:**

We will encourage further **volunteer planting days, litter picks and environmental improvement projects**, and promote sustainable practices at Council events and facilities to support a greener Flitwick.

5. Partnerships & Volunteering

This theme develops strong collaborative relationships and enhances the role of volunteers in delivering community outcomes.

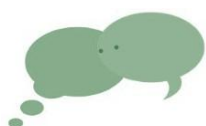

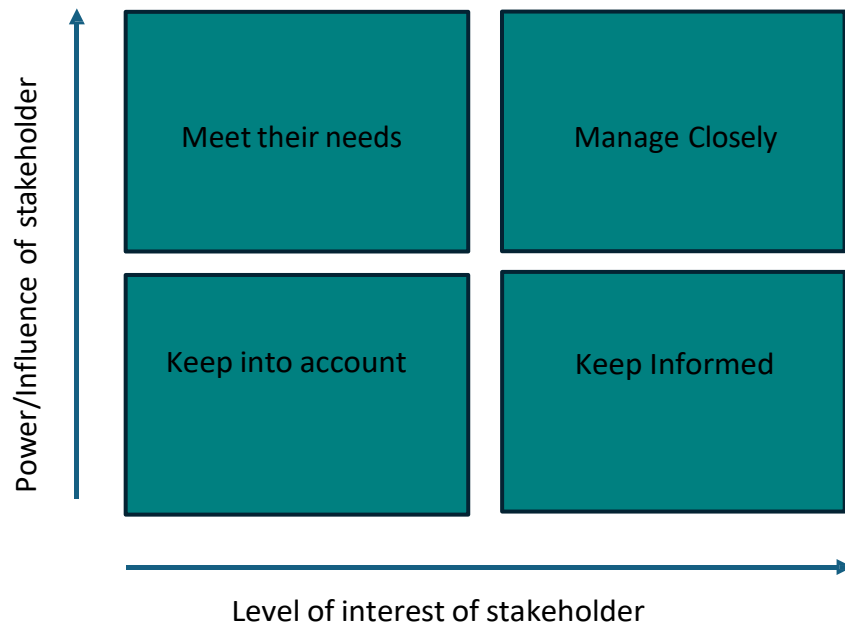

Require S106 funding to improve access to the park, including upgrades to the car park. Would like to convert the informal basketball court to a MUGA - [included on Leisure Pipeline of projects](#).

The Flitwick Nature Park (formally known as proposed Country Park) works began in 2023 and currently awaiting planning permission for redesignation and access features
Manor Park continues to require further funding to restore original features and improve facilities for residents - [S106 already secured under Green Infrastructure pot.](#)
The lake (known as Flit Water) requires significant improvements requiring funding - [included on Leisure Pipeline of projects.](#)
Add Flitwick Town Square (Station Road, Flitwick, MK45 1JT) - [Leisure not sure where this is. Could be Station Road Informal Open Space, in which case, is already on GIS](#)

Request that Flitwick Cricket Club now removed from the Flitwick Parish schedule. 2nd Ground project now completed and the club house is the responsibility of the club to fundraise (and approach Sport England for). Has already received significant S106 funding to the detriment of other sports and local groups - [Leisure cannot remove the CC from the schedule as they still have a legitimate project that requires funding. However, Leisure will prioritise other projects for S106 that the Town Council or other local sports clubs identify \(as below\).](#)

For Wingfield Recreation Ground, MPC are currently working on an improvement project for the play area with new trampoline, accessible roundabout, zipline/cableway, and additional slide, and sensory equipment for non-verbal & toddlers. For Wingfield Recreation Ground, MPC are currently working on a project to add teenage play space with a football wall, with netball and basketball hoops, and half-court markings, plus swing seats, and benches for social cohesiveness, as a response to anti-social behaviour issues. For Wingfield Recreation Ground in The Brache, Maulden Parish Council held a consultation with residents in January 2025 including regular users Maulden Magpies FC and HLB Runners. Local requirements currently are for a multi-purpose community hub including cafe area and social space, which would include the ability to section off for changing facilities as required. MPC have an ongoing refurbishment project which meets this identified need plus installing accessible toilet facilities and accessible access to the building to allow it to become a more inclusive environment, along with a bigger canopy at the front as a shelter for watching football and runners' warm-ups, etc, as well as for the cafe, plus outdoor tables and benches. Currently talking to builders for costs, expected to be in the region of £100-£150k, and timescale of 2026-2027 - [included on Leisure Pipeline of projects](#).

New benches and picnic benches would be an improvement, at a cost of £1500 for a picnic bench and £750 for a bench - noted - [included on Leisure Pipeline of projects](#).

For the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Community Orchard more facilities are required, accessible benches, picnic tables, etc, 3 more picnic tables at total cost including installation £1500 each - [included on Leisure Pipeline of projects](#).

Memorial Benches and Trees Policy

Overview

Flitwick Town Council applies this bench and tree policy to standardise the provision of memorial benches and trees. The policy specifies recycled 'plastic wood' benches with a 25-year guarantee and 'natural hardwood' benches with a 10-year guarantee and sets out an approach for replacing trees that are lost. Together, these measures support sustainability and help nurture the local environment.

Introduction

Flitwick Town Council receive requests from residents who wish to place memorials within a public open space or park. When loved ones die, their friends and relatives may want to commemorate them with a lasting memorial. Often this will be in the form of a bench or a tree which not only honours their memory but provides a functional improvement to the local environment.

This policy sets out how we approve requests for memorial benches and trees, who is responsible for their upkeep, what is expected from the Council and the donor and what happens when the bench or tree reaches end of life.

What is covered by the policy

This policy covers any memorial bench or tree placed on Flitwick Town Council owned land or property. The policy is relevant to any resident who has commissioned or is thinking about commissioning a memorial bench or tree.

Legal

The planting of memorial trees or installation of memorial benches on land as memorials, is a private arrangement between the donor and the landowner (Flitwick Town Council). As such the Council can only approve memorials on Town Council owned land. The Council can support applications for benches or trees to be installed or planted on the public highway, but permission is required from Central Bedfordshire Council.

Normally, installing benches and trees will not be subject to planning permission, restrictive covenants or other restrictions. However, there may be cases where the Council is unable to install benches for these reasons.

Under the Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998, the Council must consider the effect of its decisions on crime and disorder. The Council may consider a location unsuitable if it may attract antisocial behaviour.

When the Council approves an installation, they are purchased by the applicant and donated to the Council. The tree or bench then become the property of the Council, and the donor does not retain any right to determine its future management.

The Council will ensure the memorial is properly maintained and cared for. The applicant agrees to provide the Council with up-to-date contact details so the donor can be notified.

Application Procedure

Requests for a memorial bench or tree should be made by email – info@flitwick.gov.uk to the Town Clerk. The Council will endeavour to accommodate any reasonable requests for the installation of memorial benches or planting of memorial trees on Council owned land and property only. Requests may not be approved if the location is deemed unsuitable due to over population of trees or benches, risk of vandalism and anti-social behaviour, or other material factors. Only trees suitable, in-keeping to the immediate surrounds and bench from the Council's approved list will be considered.

1. Initial enquiry emailed to info@flitwick.gov.uk
2. Applicant directed to www.flitwick.gov.uk to view the policy and download and application form. This information can be posted or emailed by request.
3. The applicant will complete the application form specifying all requested information. The request will be considered by the Clerk.
4. Should the specific location of the memorial not be clear, a site visit will be arranged. If the requested location is not suitable, alternatives may be offered.
5. A full quotation will be sent to the applicant in line with the specifics along with a plaque proof, if applicable.
6. On agreement, an email will be sent to the applicant to confirm arrangements and request payment in full.
7. When payment is received, the Council will place the order for the memorial.
8. Delivery and installation of the memorial have a completion target of two months from receipt of payment (subject to suppliers lead times).
9. The applicant will be informed by email with a photograph of the memorial to confirm the memorial is in place.

From this point the ownership of the memorial is with the Town Council. An allocated Officer will ensure that all the work has been carried out as specified, photographs of the memorial and ensures all information is recorded in the asset register for future reference.

Costs

The cost of the tree or bench will include any plaques/inscription, delivery, and planting/installation costs (e.g.; fixings, tree guard, paving or base around the bench).

Operating Principles

1. Only sites which do not already have enough benches will be considered. This will be determined by any site-specific management plans or by any Committee with this designated responsibility.
2. Suitable locations within the Town where people are likely to make good use of the bench will be considered. These will be areas which lack any seating nearby or are at a likely stopping point such as a particular view or rest point on a path. In addition, the location will be chosen to minimise maintenance and possible vandalism. Remote locations with poor access for maintenance and users will not be considered.
3. A limited selection of suitable low maintenance standard designs for memorial benches will be available at a range of costs, the choice of bench being dependent on the location.

4. Occasionally a unique rather than standard bench design may be requested as a memorial. In these circumstances, details of the bench construction, materials and specifications will need to be submitted to the Town Council for approval. On approval the bench would then be supplied to Town Council for installation in an agreed location. There is no guarantee that damage could be repaired, and any costly repairs would be at the discretion and cost of the original applicant.

5. The cost and life expectancy of the bench will depend on the type of bench and its location. To ensure installation is undertaken safely to the required standards, the Council will provide and install the memorial bench with plaque and surfacing in all cases. The applicant's costs will include the bench, plaque, inscription, installation & surfacing, and, as the benches should require minimal maintenance, there will be a moderate 10 year 'up front' charge for this, included in the initial purchase price.

6. Retention of a memorial bench will be for the expected life period of the bench only, after which time it may be removed. Removed plaques will be offered to the original applicant where practical. Any replacement bench on that site would be treated in the same way as a new memorial bench.

7. The Council's standards of maintenance will be accepted as keeping the bench fit for purpose and clean. This will involve occasionally removing built up algae and grime, removal of graffiti and repairing minor faults within resources available. There is a move away from regular painting as in the long term this proves more costly than just replacing the bench when it has reached the end of its natural life. The range of new benches has been chosen for durability without the need for regular painting or treatment.

Installing/Planting

The arrangements for ordering and installing the bench or tree will be made directly by the Town Council once a specification has been agreed with the donor and once financial donation has been received by the Council.

Benches can be installed at any time of the year and will be installed by the Council's Public Realm Team.

Tree planting will usually only be permitted between late autumn and early spring, in line with tree planting season and will be planted by the Council's Public Realm Team.

By prior arrangement, donors are welcome to be present at the tree planting and/or bench installation.

Plaques

Commemorative plaques can be affixed to a memorial bench or placed next to a memorial tree, subject to agreeing the sizing, wording and specification with the Council.

Plaques may be subject to vandalism, and any replacement costs will need to be met by the donor.

A plaque proof will be emailed to the donor for approval.

The plaque will be removed at the end of the memorial's natural life, and the Council will contact the donor offering to return the plaque or give you the opportunity to purchase/donate another bench/tree. If the Council is unable to contact, you after three attempts the plaque will be disposed of.

Maintenance

The Council only source and purchase high quality, durable benches and will endeavour to maintain and care for the memorial bench or tree. Donors should be aware that benches or young trees in public areas may be subject to vandalism and the Council will not be held responsible for any costs in replacing them.

The Council endeavours to maintain and care for a memorial tree and bench for as long as possible. However, it reserves the right to re-site or remove any tree or bench that it deems to be unsafe, unrepairable or for other reason. The Council will notify the donor.

Council accepts no liability for replacing a bench or tree at the end of its useful life. When a tree or bench has been disposed, the commemoration will automatically cease. A new application will need to be made to the Council, and the Council reserves the right to agree a commemoration with a new donor.

Additional Memorials

There is to be no placing of artificial flowers or plants, soft toys or any other objects on/around the bench or tree. Fresh flowers can be placed at the memorial following written request and approval from the Council for the anniversary of the death. The flowers will be removed after 7 days.

Flitwick Town Council Burial Ground Regulations (Draft)

1. Introduction

These Regulations are made by Flitwick Town Council for the management, administration, and control of the Council's burial grounds and cemeteries.

The Regulations are intended to:

- Ensure that burial grounds are maintained in a safe, respectful, and dignified manner
- Protect the interests of grave owners, visitors, and the wider community
- Establish clear procedures for burials, memorials, and maintenance
- Support compliance with all relevant legislation and guidance.

The administration of burial grounds shall remain subject to the Council's overall governance arrangements, committee structure, delegated authority provisions, and statutory responsibilities as a local authority.

The Council will manage the burial grounds in accordance with relevant legislation and recognised sector guidance, including guidance issued by:

- The Institute of Cemetery and Crematorium Management (ICCM)
- The National Association of Memorial Masons (NAMM);
- The British Register of Accredited Memorial Masons (BRAMM);
- The Health and Safety Executive (HSE).

These Regulations apply to all persons entering or using any Burial Ground administered by the Council.

These Regulations should be read in conjunction with the Council's current burial fees and charges, application forms, and any other relevant policies or procedures.

2. Administration of the Burial Ground

General Management

The burial grounds shall be managed and controlled by the Council.

The Council reserves the right to:

- Determine areas available for burial;
- Temporarily close areas for maintenance or safety reasons;
- Refuse any application that does not comply with these Regulations;

Office Hours and Contact

Applications relating to burials, memorials, transfers of ownership, and other matters shall be submitted through the Council offices during published opening hours, normally Monday to Friday, 8.30am to 5pm, either in person, by telephone (01525 631900), or by email (info@flitwick.gov.uk).

Register of Burials

A register of burials is kept at the office of the Town Clerk, where searches may be made at reasonable times and certified extracts obtained.

3. Opening Hours and Conduct

Opening Hours

The Burial Grounds shall be open to visitors during times determined by the Council.

The Council may close the Burial Grounds, or any part of them, without notice in cases of emergency, severe weather, maintenance works, or public safety concerns.

Conduct Within the Burial Ground

All visitors shall behave in a respectful and orderly manner while within the Burial Ground.

The following are prohibited:

- Causing nuisance, disturbance, or disorder;
- Wilful damage to graves, memorials, trees, buildings, or Council property;
- Playing games or sports;
- Consumption of alcohol or illegal substances;
- Cycling, skateboarding, or use of scooters except mobility aids;
- Use of amplified music without prior permission;
- Littering or fly tipping;
- Bringing dogs into restricted areas or failing to keep dogs under proper control.
- Children under the age of 12 should be supervised by a responsible adult.

4. Purchase of Exclusive Rights of Burial

Grant of Rights

The Council may grant Exclusive Rights of Burial for periods determined by the Council and set out in the current scale of fees and charges.

The purchase of Exclusive Rights of Burial:

- Does not confer ownership of the land;
- Grants only the right to burial in the grave space and, where applicable, the right to place an approved memorial.

Deeds and Ownership

The Council shall issue a Deed of Grant to the registered grave owner.

The grave owner shall be responsible for:

- Keeping the Deed safe;
- Informing the Council of any change of address;
- Producing evidence of ownership when required.
- No burial, memorial installation, or additional inscription may take place without the written consent of the registered grave owner.

Transfer of Ownership

Ownership may be transferred in accordance with legal requirements and Council procedures.

The Council may require:

- Statutory declarations;
- Probate documentation;
- Letters of administration;
- Identity verification.

An administrative fee will apply.

Grave Spaces

Each occupied grave space will be marked on the ground with a marker corresponding to the burial plan and the register kept at the office of the Town Clerk, which may be inspected during office hours.

5. Interments

Notice of Interment

Applications for interment shall be submitted to the Council using the prescribed forms and accompanied by:

- The appropriate fees;
- Relevant certificates and statutory documentation;
- Any required permits.
- Minimum notice periods shall be determined by the Council.

Except in special circumstances, at least 48 hours' notice of an interment must be given between 8.30am and 5pm, Monday to Friday. Interments are not permitted on Sundays. In exceptional circumstances, the Council may allow an interment on a Saturday.

Grave Preparation

All graves shall be prepared by persons approved by the Council.

The Council reserves the right to:

- Determine the depth and size of graves;
- Allocate grave spaces;
- Limit the number of interments in any grave.

Adult grave spaces will measure 7ft 6in x 4ft. Grave spaces for stillborn children or children aged up to 12 years will measure 4ft x 3ft.

No grave shall exceed a depth of 7ft 6in, or 3ft in the case of cremated remains.

Coffins and Containers

All coffins, caskets, urns, and containers must be suitable for burial and comply with environmental and health requirements.

The Council may refuse any coffin or container deemed unsuitable.

Interment of Cremated Remains

The interment or scattering of cremated remains shall only take place in designated areas and with prior approval from the Council.

Applications for the interment of cremated remains must be submitted using the prescribed forms and accompanied by all relevant documentation and fees.

The Council reserves the right to determine:

- The location and allocation of plots;
- The number of interments permitted within each plot;
- The type of memorial permitted in cremated remains sections.

Containers and Urns

Urns and containers used for cremated remains must be suitable for burial and, where required by the Council, biodegradable.

The Council may refuse containers considered unsuitable, unsafe, or environmentally inappropriate.

Scattering of Cremated Remains

The scattering of cremated remains shall take place only in areas designated by the Council and only upon prior application using the prescribed forms, accompanied by all relevant documentation and fees.

6. Memorials

Approval Required

No memorial may be erected, altered, removed, or inscribed without the Council's prior written permission. No headstone or kerb set may be erected on a grave until at least six months after the interment.

Applications must include:

- A design drawing;
- Dimensions and materials;
- Proposed inscription;
- Details of the memorial mason;

Applications can only be made by the owner of the Exclusive Rights of Burial.

Approved Memorial Masons

Memorial work shall only be carried out by suitably qualified and insured memorial masons.

The Council may require:

- Evidence of accreditation;
- Public liability insurance;
- Compliance with NAMM or BRAMM standards;
- Compliance with current BS 8415 standards and ICCM guidance for memorial installation.

All memorials shall be installed using approved ground anchor systems and fixing methods appropriate to the memorial type and ground conditions.

The Council reserves the right to refuse permission for work by contractors who fail to meet required standards.

Memorial Specifications

The Council may impose:

- Maximum dimensions;
- Permitted materials and finishes;
- Foundation requirements;
- Fixing methods;

- Positioning and orientation.

Items considered inappropriate, unsafe, offensive, or excessive may be refused or removed.

Safety Inspections

The Council reserves the right to inspect memorials periodically in accordance with ICCM guidance and recognised memorial safety management procedures.

Memorial inspections may include visual checks, stability testing, and recording of condition.

Where a memorial is considered unsafe, the Council may:

- Temporarily support or cordon the memorial;
- Lay the memorial flat;
- Remove the memorial if necessary;
- Attach warning notices pending remedial works.

The Council will make reasonable efforts to contact the grave owner before taking action, except in emergencies.

The grave owner shall remain responsible for the maintenance and repair of memorials during the term of the Exclusive Right of Burial.

Sizing

Headstones must not exceed 2ft 9in x 2ft 4in. Kerb sets must not exceed 7ft x 3ft and are permitted only on graves with an Exclusive Right of Burial.

Memorial stones in the Garden of Remembrance must not exceed 10in x 12in, and wall plaques must not exceed 6in x 4in.

Damages

Anyone carrying out work related to a memorial or planting is responsible for any damage caused to paths, roads, turf, plants, neighbouring graves, or memorials, and will be charged for any necessary repairs or reinstatement.

Memorial Benches and Trees

In addition to traditional grave memorials, the Council may permit memorial benches and trees, subject to application and approval.

7. Flowers, Plants, and Decorations

The Council encourages tasteful and respectful floral tributes and decorations while ensuring that the burial grounds remain safe, dignified, and maintainable.

Permitted Items

Fresh flowers and removable containers may be placed on graves.

Artificial flowers and decorations may be permitted subject to seasonal or maintenance requirements.

One vase per plot is permitted in the Garden of Remembrance.

No additional vases shall be permitted on a vault.

Prohibited Items

The Council may remove without notice:

- Broken glass or hazardous items;

- Fencing, edging, chippings, or kerbing not authorised by the Council;
- Trees or shrubs planted without permission;
- Items obstructing maintenance;
- Offensive or inappropriate decorations.

Seasonal Clearance

The Council may carry out periodic clearance of faded flowers, wreaths, and decorations.

Notices will be displayed in advance of clearance operations where practicable.

8. Maintenance and Grounds Management

The Council shall maintain the burial grounds to an appropriate standard.

Routine maintenance will include:

- Grass cutting;
- Hedge trimming;
- Tree management;
- Path maintenance;
- General landscaping.

Visitors and grave owners shall not interfere with Council maintenance operations.

The Council is not responsible for damage caused by:

- Natural deterioration;
- Severe weather;
- Subsidence;
- Acts of third parties;
- Necessary maintenance operations carried out with reasonable care.

Where, in the Council's opinion, a grave is neglected to such an extent that it detracts from adjacent grave spaces or from the general appearance of the Burial Ground, the Council reserves the right, after giving due notice by recorded delivery to the last known address, to level the grave space, re-turf it, and remove kerb stones where appropriate.

Nothing may be placed on the grass if it interferes with maintenance of the area.

9. Vehicles

Vehicles may only be driven within the burial grounds on authorised roads and routes.

Drivers must:

- Proceed at low speed;
- Give priority to pedestrians and funeral corteges;
- Follow instructions from Council staff.
- The Council may restrict vehicle access at any time.

10. Exhumations

No exhumation shall take place except:

- In accordance with the law;
- With all required licences and permissions;
- Subject to Council approval.

The Council may impose conditions relating to timing, supervision, and public safety.

Remains interred in a family plot shall not be exhumed for the purpose of enlarging or deepening the grave. No exhumation may take place until all lawful arrangements have been made.

11. Records and Data Protection

The Council shall maintain burial records in accordance with statutory requirements.

Personal data shall be processed in accordance with applicable data protection legislation.

The Council may charge fees for searches, copies, or certified extracts.

12. Applications, Fees and Charges

Fees and charges shall be determined by the Council and reviewed periodically.

Current fees shall be published by the Council and can be found on the Town Council website.

The Council reserves the right to:

- Apply different fees for residents and non-residents;
- Refuse services where fees remain unpaid.

Applications for burial in Flitwick Burial Ground from non-residents, or from persons who have not lived in the town continuously for the ten years immediately preceding the date of death, will be subject to the non-resident fees set by the Council.

- Charges will be four times the standard fees, excluding the cost of services provided by the Town Council Public Realm Team.

Exceptions are made for the following reasons:

- The deceased died while living in a hospital, nursing home, care home, or similar institution, and their last permanent residence had been within Flitwick continuously for the previous ten years.

The fee for scattering ashes in the Garden of Remembrance for a non-resident will be twice the standard charge.

All fees and charges must be paid to the Town Council upon invoice.

No fee shall be charged for private memorials erected by relatives over Service Graves, or for inscriptions on memorials commemorating members of H M Forces serving at the time of death. This exemption shall also apply to Police and Fire Service officers who died in the line of duty.

13. Health and Safety

The Council shall manage burial grounds with due regard to:

- The Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974;
- Local Authorities' Cemeteries Order 1977;
- ICCM Management Guidance;
- Relevant British Standards and industry best practice.

All contractors, memorial masons, funeral directors, and visitors must comply with applicable health and safety requirements.

The Council may require risk assessments, method statements, and evidence of insurance before permitting work within the burial grounds.

Any person creating a hazard or failing to comply with safety requirements may be instructed to leave the site.

14. Liability

Persons entering the burial grounds do so at their own risk.

The Council accepts no responsibility for loss, theft, or damage to personal property unless caused by the negligence of the Council.

15. Enforcement

Any person contravening these Regulations may:

- Be required to leave the burial grounds;
- Have memorial applications refused;
- Be liable for costs incurred by the Council in remedying breaches.

The Council reserves all rights available under relevant legislation.

Any person who wilfully damages or defaces any building, wall, fence, tree, plant, monument, tablet, inscription, or gravestone within the Burial Ground, causes any other wilful damage, plays games or sports, discharges firearms (except at a military funeral), unlawfully disrupts a burial service, allows a dog to foul the Burial Ground, or commits any nuisance there, may be liable to prosecution.

16. Governance and Decision Making

The operation of the burial grounds shall fall under the authority of Flitwick Town Council or any committee, sub-committee, or officer properly authorised under the Council's Scheme of Delegation.

The Council will:

- Set and review fees and charges;
- Approve operational procedures;
- Designate burial areas and memorial types;
- Determine applications and disputes;
- Delegate operational decisions to authorised officers.

Nothing within these Regulations shall override the Council's statutory duties, delegated powers, or governance arrangements.

Where operational matters are not specifically addressed within these Regulations, the Proper Officer or authorised officer may determine appropriate action consistent with:

- Relevant legislation;
- Council policy;
- ICCM and industry guidance;
- Health and safety requirements;
- Principles of fairness and good administration.

17. Review

These Regulations shall be kept under periodic review by the Council and may be amended from time to time to ensure continued compliance with legislation, operational requirements, and recognised industry guidance.

18. Definitions

In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:

“Burial Ground” means any cemetery, churchyard extension, burial site, memorial garden, or area administered by the Council.

“Council” means Flitwick Town Council.

“Exclusive Right of Burial” means the legal right granted by the Council to bury in a specified grave for a fixed period.

“Grave Owner” means the person registered with the Council as holder of the Exclusive Right of Burial.

“Memorial” includes headstones, kerbs, plaques, vases, crosses, tablets, benches, and any other commemorative structure.

“Registered Memorial Mason” means a memorial contractor approved or accredited in accordance with current industry standards.

“Interment” means burial of human remains or cremated remains.

BURIAL GROUNDS REGULATIONS

1. A register of burials is kept at the office of the Town Clerk where at reasonable times, searches may be made, and certified extracts obtained.
2. Each occupied grave space will be marked on the ground by a marker corresponding with one on the plan, and in a Register to be kept in the Office of the Town Clerk, which can be viewed during working hours.
3. Except in special cases, at least two days notice of any interment must be given between the hours of 9.00 am and 4.00 pm Monday to Thursday and 9.00 am to 3.00 pm Friday, at the Office of the Town Clerk. Interment will not be allowed on Sunday.
 - 3.1 Special permission must be sought from the Town Council for Saturday.
4. Remains interred in a family plot, shall never be exhumed for the purpose of enlarging or deepening the grave.
5. Exhumation can only be carried out after lawful arrangements have been made.
6. Applications for burial in Flitwick Burial Ground from non-residents or persons who have not lived in The Town continuously for a period of ten (10) years immediately prior to the date of death— charges will be four (4) times all charges enumerated apart from the cost of the services of the Town Council Groundstaff.

Exceptions are made for the following reasons:- He/she died while resident in a hospital, nursing home, older person's home or institution of any kind and their last place of residence had been within Flitwick continuously for the previous ten years.

The scattering of ashes in the Garden of Remembrance of a non-resident will be twice (2) times the charge stated.
7. All fees and charges are to be paid to the Town Council upon invoice.
8. A fee will not be charged for private memorials erected by relatives over Service Graves, nor for inscriptions on memorials commemorating members serving in H M Forces at the time of death. This also applies to Police and Fire Service officers who have died in the line of duty.
9. Purchases or owners of the exclusive right of burial in any ground in perpetuity cannot transfer their rights therein to any other person, or persons without written consent of the Council and every such transfer shall be surrendered to the Council for the purpose of transfer to the person, or persons to whom the owners desire.
10. Sufficient evidence of a right to inter in a purchased grave shall be produced, if required, at the Office of the Town Clerk at the time of application for interment. If the evidence is not available, an indemnity must be signed.
11. If a grave is re-opened an indemnity form must be signed.
12. All gravestones, monuments, memorials and inscriptions are subject to the approval of the Council, and a drawing showing the form and dimensions of every memorial proposed to be erected, must be sent to the Office of the Town Clerk for approval.
13. Headstones must be no more than 2ft 6inches x 2ft 4inches on an Exclusive Right of Burial plot only.
14. Vaults and brick graves are not permitted.
 - 14.1 Kerbs are permitted (as from 8th August 2007), subject to written application and approval.

15. Space for a vase for cut flowers, pot plants, or Christmas wreaths will be permitted as part of a headstone. Six months will be allowed for vases and crosses on a grave, before a head stone is erected.
16. Clearance of flowers and wreaths will be carried out after 2 weeks.
17. All memorials are to be kept in good repair by the owners, or their lawful successors, unless special agreement is made with the Council, and if not repaired after due notice, may be removed by Order of the Council.
18. Any damage caused to paths, roads, turf, plants, adjacent graves or memorials, as a consequence of any work being carried out relating to a memorial or planting shall be held to be the responsibility of the person or persons concerned, who will be charged for repairs/reinstatement.
19. Nothing must be put on the grass that impedes the maintenance of the area.
20. Where, in the opinion of the Council, any grave or graves are neglected so as to be detrimental to adjacent spaces and the general appearance of the cemetery, the Council reserves the right, after due notice, (served to the last known address by recorded delivery) to level off such spaces and re-turf and remove kerb stones where appropriate.
21. Every person is liable to prosecution who shall wilfully destroy, damage or deface any building, wall or fence, belonging to the Burial Ground, destroy or injure any tree or plant therein, wilfully destroy or injure, or deface any monument, tablet, inscription or gravestone, do any other wilful damage, play at any game or sport, or discharge firearms (save at a Military Funeral) in the Burial Ground wilfully and unlawfully disturb any persons assembled therein for the purpose of burying anybody therein, or permitting dogs to foul the Burial Ground, commit any nuisance within the Burial Ground, .

GARDENS OF REMEMBRANCE

22. Standard rose trees in Memorial may be planted after first obtaining permission from the Town Council. The Town Council have the right to remove rose trees after they have exceeded their useful flowering period span. The donor of the tree will be informed and have the opportunity to replace it with another.
23. The Town Council Grounds Staff are responsible for marking out plots in the Garden of Remembrance, the burying of the cremated remains and the laying of the memorial stones on the plots, and also fixing of the memorial plaques on the wall, surrounding the Garden of Remembrance 1.

A fee will be charged for this service.
24. Only one (1) vase per plot is permitted in the Gardens of Remembrance. (as from 8th August 2007)
25. Where there is a Vault no additional vases will be permitted (as from 8th August 2007)

Report to Community Services 02.06.2026 Allotment, Burial Ground & Pitch Hire Fees

Background

The Council review the fees annually for services within the Town which include allotments, burial ground and football pitch hire.

Allotment rent increases must be noted at the Allotment AGM a year in advance, which takes place in October each year.

The Town Council did not increase allotment fees for 2025/26 or 2026/27. The allotment fees for 2027/28 were increased by 5%.

The Town Council did not increase fees for the burial ground for 2025/26. An administration fee for the transfer of Exclusive Rights of Burial was added in 2026/27.

The Town Council did not increase fees for pitch hire for 2025/26 or 2026/27.

Introduction

A fee comparison exercise has been carried out by the Amenities Officer with other local Councils. Please see attached appendix 1.

A time study for allotment administration and maintenance has been completed. Please see attached appendix 2.

Comparison Summary

Allotments:

- FTC'S plot fees are generally lower in comparison to other Council's;
- The average yearly allotment rent works out to be £48.59. Last years average was £46.80, a 3.82% average increase.
- For FTC to be inline with the average rate it would mean an increase of 70.13%
- Deposits have been introduced to offset costs when a tenant vacates a plot – ie; when a plot is left in an unsuitable condition to re-let and/or rubbish is left behind;
- No Council provided port-a-loos, two provide compostable toilets with most providing no toilet facilities.

Time Study:

- It is worth noting that the average cost for officer time equates to approximately £70.55 per allotment plot.

Burial Ground:

- Although the fees vary FTC's fees are average across the board;
- Noticeably, all Council's compared charge for Transfer of Exclusive Rights.

Pitch Hire:

- Pitch fees vary across the Council's although the average for a Junior pitch is £28.85;
- It is worth noting that all Council's compared, have changing facilities.

Other Information

Burial ground fees and Pitch hire fees are applied from April-March and Allotment rent is applied from January to January.

Consideration should be given following the decision to no longer fund toilet facilities and the impact on allotment holders at Steppingley Road with the proposed development.

Councils have a statutory duty to provide Allotments under the Small Holdings and Allotments Act 1908.

Recommendations/Options

Allotments

1. To consider increasing the Allotment fees for 2028/29 by 25% (£35.70)
NB; 5% £29.98, 10% £31.41, 15% £32.84, 20% £34.27, 25% £35.70, 50% £42.84

Burial Ground

1. To consider Burial Fees for 2027/28 to remain the same

Pitch Hire

1. To consider Pitch hire fees to increase by 5% for 2027/28

Report to Community Services 02.06.2026 Hemlock – Manor Park.

Background

Members and Manor Park Working Group are aware of ongoing issues with invasive species within Manor Park, particularly Hemlock in a contained area within the park and previously Ragwort. The Ragwort was successfully treated in Spring 2024 although this does not mean it has been eradicated permanently.

Introduction

An agronomist was instructed to visit Manor Park and report their findings and options for management of the Hemlock. Please see below:

Hemlock – Issues at Flitwick Manor Park

History

There have been historic issues in the Park of Hemlock and Ragwort ingressions.

This was successfully controlled by the overall use of Aminopyralid and Fluroxypyr in the Spring of 2024.

On inspection in the Spring of 2026 the levels of Ragwort have been significantly reduced but there is still an issue with Hemlock.

Hemlock

It may help to provide a basis guide to Hemlock's basic morphology

The plant is usually a biennial but occasionally perennial

It is from the Carrot (umbellifers family) but will grow up to 3 metres high

The plant carries neurotoxins which are deadly if ingested and can cause dermatitis on sensitive skin if touched. It should never be handled with bare hands

Pollen is not toxic, but the seeds are

Exclusion and removal

Options

- 1. Fence the area to prevent contact with the public and their animals and allow nature to take its course*
- 2. Small areas-Individual plants could be dug up and bagged*
- 3. Larger areas- A selective herbicide could be applied- 24D and Dicamba are effective or Grazon Pro, which contains Triclopyr, could be applied by knap sack handheld sprayer*
- 4. Total weed control-The overall spraying of high rates of Glyphosate.*

If plants are removed, they should remain bagged until the plant breaks down.

It should never be cut down and burnt as this is dangerous to the operative and toxic to the environment as the toxins will be in the smoke

Everyone and everything should be excluded from the area until the plants are dead

The key point in any of these options is to keep the public away from actively growing plants at all times. The most important point to remember is that the public is prevented from becoming in contact with the plant.

Additional Matters

Costs will be covered by the revenue budget.

Officers are in the process of sourcing fencing to restrict access to the affected areas.

Recommendations

Members to consider options 2, 3 & 4 listed above.

1. Manor Park

MPWG:

The next MPWG is happening on Thursday – 4th June. All are welcome to attend anytime between 9am and 12noon. Some of the tasks the group will be working on this week include continuing bramble and epicormic growth removal, removal of an old cattle pen and dispersal of removed logs.

Cattle:

Stock fence repairs are now complete, and the cattle have returned to graze at Manor Park for another season. The cattle provide effective management of the grass fields whilst being a welcome addition for visitors to the park to see.



2. Millennium Park



Roundabout:

The new accessible roundabout has now been installed in the park. Officers are working on the sign off on the installation. The play area surfacing has been delayed due to the weather, and it has been unfortunate that the park was unable to open for the school half term holiday.

Eat Feast:

Eat Feast were back on Millennium Park on Saturday 30th May between 4pm & 9pm for their first of 3 events in Flitwick this year.

3. Play Areas

Maintenance:

Following negotiations with the supplier, the basket swing replacement beam has now been ordered, and we hope to have the basket swing back up before the summer holidays.

Annual Inspections:

Annual inspections will be carried out by an independent company within the next month. Officers have instructed a new contractor for these inspections to align with the new SaferPlay

app. An update including forward plan and life expectancy will be presented to Members in the coming months.

4. Nature Park

Guided Walk:

A FREE guided walk will take place tomorrow evening - Wednesday 3rd June at 7pm. Working in partnership with Guy Lambourne from Wassledine, a local hazel coppicing entity.

The event will look to encourage interest in volunteering opportunities within the park whilst learning about the park's history, planting, management and future plans.

Redborne Project:

The group of Redborne students spent the day at Flitwick Nature Park on 20th May as part of their project; How much carbon can a newly planted woodland sequester?

Working with Professor Paul Burgess from Cranfield University, the students spent time measuring tree sizes and collecting soil samples. The samples are now in the school's science labs where the students will be analysing them.

In the future the students will be attending a Community Services meeting to present their findings to Members.



5. Allotments

Rotavator:

The new rotavator and service from the Council has been welcomed by allotment holders and 7 plot holders have used the service to date this season.

6. Tiny Forrest

Following a meeting with CBC and Earthwatch a Tiny Forest Discovery Day has been set-up to take place in the summer holidays. The Discovery Day will engage families and residents to collect important data from the Forest. Unfortunately, a large number of the tree planted in the Forest haven't survived and collecting this data will help formulate management moving forward. A tree count will also be conducted and a tree planting will take place in the Autumn/Winter to replace some of the lost trees. These trees will be provided by Earthwatch and it is worth noting that the general management of the Forest remains with Earthwatch with

help from registered Tree Keepers.

The Community Payback team will be spending some time in the Tiny Forest over the coming weeks to reduce the grasses and remove weeds.

7. Public Realm Team

The PRT remain on top of the regular maintenance working with a two-weekly maintenance schedule. The team have recently added watering into their schedule due to the recent warm weather.

Summer planting will be seen across the town imminently. The team recently planted out at the Rufus Centre.

Flitwick Community Fridge Update

The new Fridge Hub opened on Tuesday 26th May. Volunteers worked in very hot conditions to prepare the space, including cleaning and relocating fridges, a freezer and storage racks. The move has been completed successfully and the new hub is now operational.

Following a review of visitor patterns, opening times have been amended to better reflect community need. The new afternoon sessions will better support attendance after the school run. In addition, the Wednesday Supported session will move to the afternoon, reflecting changes to collections from the Sofea warehouse and improving the range of food available. A further Supported session will also be introduced on Saturday mornings from 13th June.

There has been an increase in the volume of food with short use-by dates. In response, additional use-by sessions are now being delivered on Friday and Sunday evenings, with attendance of up to 20 people at these sessions. Subject to food volumes, a Saturday use-by session will also be made available. These arrangements continue to support the aim of minimising food waste.

As previously reported, food collection sources have been diversified, reducing reliance on Tesco as the primary supplier. As a result, 48% of food now comes from alternative sources. While this has increased the number of evening collections, volunteers have continued to provide valuable support to maintain service delivery.

Membership has increased to 810 households, including 233 households on the Supported tier. There are currently 239 children within these households.

Councillor Snape has further developed the CRM system so that it can now be used to record daily cleaning and temperature checks. This provides a more efficient process and enables officers to carry out monitoring more effectively.
